**SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL 17-003**

101      **CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF "FIRST RESPONDER**  
102                    **APPRECIATION DAY".**

1            WHEREAS, First responders risk their own safety and personal  
2 property in the execution of their duties to protect the public on a daily  
3 basis; and

4            WHEREAS, First responders are the first line of defense for the  
5 public against threats, both domestic and foreign; and

6            WHEREAS, Nationally, on average, first responders are injured  
7 on the job three times more often than workers in other occupations; and

8            WHEREAS, Four out of five medics have been injured on the job,  
9 more than half (52%) have been assaulted by a patient, and half (50%)

1 have been exposed to an infectious disease; and

2 WHEREAS, Most emergency medical service personnel deaths in  
3 the line of duty occur in ambulance accidents; and

4 WHEREAS, Police and firefighters experience workplace injuries  
5 four times more often than the national average, most often due to  
6 overexertion; and

7 WHEREAS, First responder deaths constitute five percent of  
8 occupational fatalities nationwide; and

9 WHEREAS, First responders experience high levels of stress and  
10 many struggle with mental health issues, such as post-traumatic stress  
11 disorder (PTSD), and family members of first responders often develop  
12 PTSD as well; and

13 WHEREAS, Thousands of first responders have made the ultimate  
14 sacrifice, including emergency medical services personnel, who have an  
15 estimated fatality rate of 12.7 per 100,000 workers, more than twice the  
16 national average, and many police officers who have lost their lives in the  
17 line of duty, including three in Colorado in the last year; and

18 WHEREAS, First responders stand at the ready to come to the aid  
19 of the citizens of the United States of America twenty-four hours a day;  
20 and

21 WHEREAS, First responders are a vital part of our communities,  
22 not only standing ready to deal with emergencies but also volunteering in  
23 our schools and community organizations; and

24 WHEREAS, Individuals, both career and volunteer, including  
25 police, fire, emergency medical services, search and rescue, and other  
26 organizations in the public safety sector, come together as a collective to  
27 aid the public in the event of an emergency; and

28 WHEREAS, There are over 1 million firefighters in the United  
29 States, and over 750,000 of those are volunteer firefighters; and

30 WHEREAS, There are over 800,000 emergency medical services  
31 personnel in the United States; and

1           WHEREAS, There are over 750,000 state and local law  
2 enforcement officers around the country; and

3           WHEREAS, Colorado joins the following states in designating  
4 September 27 as "First Responder Appreciation Day": Alabama, Alaska,  
5 Arkansas, Arizona, Delaware, Illinois, Iowa, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland,  
6 Massachusetts, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North  
7 Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South  
8 Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia, and Wisconsin; and

9           WHEREAS, The Colorado General Assembly wishes to honor and  
10 support all first responders with an annual day of appreciation; now,  
11 therefore,

12           *Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly*  
13 *of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:*

14           (1) That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly,  
15 designate September 27, 2017, as "First Responder Appreciation Day";

16           (2) That we recognize and honor all first responders who put their  
17 lives on the line daily to serve and protect the people of Colorado; and

18           (3) That we urge the United States Congress and President Donald  
19 J. Trump to declare September 27 National First Responders Appreciation  
20 Day to honor all first responders nationwide.
