37	with such Joint Rule 39, to start prior to the convening of the next regular
38	session, they may be paid at the rate specified in this resolution from the
39	date they are authorized to start.

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(2) That the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives remain in such capacity after adjournment of the General Assembly *sine die* until the convening of the First Regular Session of the Seventy-fourth General Assembly in January, 2023.

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- (3) That the President of the Senate and the Chair of the House Services Committee, with the authorization of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, are hereby separately authorized to retain and hire replacements for such employees for such period of time in the interim between the Second Regular Session of the Seventy-third General Assembly and the First Regular Session of the Seventy-fourth General Assembly as they deem necessary for their respective houses; except that the office equipment of the General Assembly and the services of such employees shall be used only in connection with official legislative business.
- (4) That the President of the Senate and the Chair of the House Services Committee, with the authorization of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, are hereby separately authorized to hire such session-only employees for the next regular session as they deem necessary for their respective houses and who may start their employment on the date authorized.

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
