SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 21-004

101	CONCERNING A TEMPORARY ADJOURNMENT OF THE FIRST REGULAR
102	SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

WHEREAS, On March 10, 2020, Governor Jared Polis declared
a state of epidemic disaster emergency in Colorado due to the COVID-19
pandemic; the governor has subsequently renewed the declaration of a
statewide public health disaster emergency approximately every 30 days
since the initial declaration; and the declaration of a statewide public
health disaster emergency remains in place at this time; and

WHEREAS, With the Governor's declaration of a statewide public
health disaster emergency, the provisions of Joint Rule 44 of the Joint
Rules of the Senate and House of Representatives became effective and
remain in effect at this time; and

1	WHEREAS, As of January 13, 2021, the Colorado Department of
2	Public Health and Environment reported that there have been 366,774
3	people infected with COVID-19 in Colorado, 4,386 people in Colorado
4	have died of the virus, 814 people are hospitalized in Colorado with the
5	virus, and 73% of the intensive care unit hospital beds in Colorado are in
6	use for persons who are infected with the virus; and
7	WHEREAS, As of January 13, 2021, 60 of the 64 counties in
8	Colorado were at "level orange: high risk" on the state COVID dial,
9	which is based on the incidence of COVID-19 infections, the positivity
10	rate for COVID-19 testing, and the number of hospitalizations for
11	COVID-19 infection; and
12	WHEREAS, As of January 13, 2021, 51 counties had a two-week
13	cumulative incidence rate of 350 COVID-19 cases for every 100,000
14	people; and
15	WHEREAS, As of January 13, 2021, 44 counties had a two-week
16	average positivity testing rate greater than five percent; for 12 of those
17	counties, the positivity rate was over 10%; and for three of those counties,
18	the positivity rate was over 15%; and
19	WHEREAS, National health experts have warned that the states
20	may experience a post-holiday surge in COVID-19 infections, which
21	would likely be evident within the month of January; and
22	WHEREAS, Temporarily adjourning the General Assembly will
23	help to protect legislators, legislative staff, and members of the public
24	from potential exposure to COVID-19 by postponing the large gatherings
25	that accompany committee hearings and floor proceedings until the
26	General Assembly reconvenes in mid-February, at which time legislators,
27	legislative staff, and the public will be able to more safely congregate and
28	participate in activities of the legislative session; now, therefore,
29	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-third General
30	Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives
31	concurring herein:
32	That, when the General Assembly temporarily adjourns on January
33	15, 2021, it shall adjourn until 10:00 A.M. on February 16, 2021, unless,
34	before said date, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
35	of Representatives issue a joint statement recalling the General Assembly
