SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 21-016
CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF THE INTERSTATE 25 BRIDGE OVER
17TH AVENUE AS THE "RICHARD "RJ" LAWRENCE BRIDGE".
WHEREAS, Richard "RJ" Lawrence was president and CEO of
Lawrence Construction, a family-owned company founded in 1924 and
headquartered in Littleton, Colorado; and
WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence was a fourth generation Coloradan,
born in Denver, Colorado, to Earl Roger Lawrence and Betty Jo Otto
Lawrence along with siblings Barbara Jo and William Roger; and
WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence graduated from Arapahoe High School
in 1974, graduated from Colorado State University in 1978, and earned
his professional engineering license in 1984; and

1 2 3	WHEREAS, In 1982, RJ Lawrence married Polly Petersen and they had two children, Anne Kathleen Lawrence and Scott Roger Lawrence; and
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, In 1995, RJ Lawrence took over managing Lawrence Construction full time and worked both in the field and with design partners to ensure the best outcomes for construction projects across Colorado; and
8 9 10 11 12	WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence was the President of the Colorado Contractors Association in 2011 and was the Colorado Contractor of the Year in 2013, and he was a founding member of the Rocky Mountain Minority Contractor Association to help the industry be more inclusive; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence successfully pioneered fast-track and design-build technologies that have been well-received in the construction industry; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, In 1996, he pioneered the 48-hour bridge: Using pre-cast concrete to replace a bridge over Mitchell Gulch in Douglas County in 48 hours; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS, Lawrence Construction often worked on notable projects in Colorado, including environmental reclamation work and the Interstate 25 bridge over 17th Avenue; and
22 23 24	WHEREAS, This bridge, sometimes called "Bronco Bridge", showcases value-engineered pre-cast concrete arches honoring the history of the original steel arches; and
25 26	WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence pioneered pre-cast, pre-stressed curved U-tub girders to enhance bridge design and construction; and
27 28 29	WHEREAS, The E-470 "flyover" bridge was the first in the world to have pre-cast curved U-tub girders spliced on the ground and set on piers; and
30 31 32	WHEREAS, The pre-stressed curved U-tub girders used to build the elevated interchange in Trinidad, Colorado, were the first in the world: and

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1 2 3	WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence was the first to build U-tub girder bridges for the Nevada/Tejon interchange in Colorado Springs, saving the state hundreds of thousands of dollars on the project; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, When RJ Lawrence proposed building curved pre-cast, pre-stressed U-tub girders, he was told it couldn't be done, and he proved them wrong through engineering; and
7 8	WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence was known for his saying, "You can't hardly"; and
9 10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence was a pioneer for Colorado's highways and infrastructure. He was a contractor who inspired innovation through outside-the-box ideas that have helped to drive Colorado's infrastructure to new levels. RJ's ideas have shown what is possible in Colorado heavy civil construction and beyond; and
14 15 16	WHEREAS, RJ Lawrence was always proud to be a Colorado contractor and built some of Colorado's best infrastructure projects; now, therefore,
17 18 19	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
20 21	(1) That the Interstate 25 bridge over 17th Avenue be officially designated as the "Richard "RJ" Lawrence Bridge";
22 23 24 25	(2) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may accept and expend gifts, grants, and donations for the purpose of the initial placement of signs on either side of the bridge for the "Richard "RJ" Lawrence Bridge"; and
26 27 28	(3) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may explore a cooperative agreement with the city and county of Denver for the maintenance of the markings for the "Richard "RJ" Lawrence Bridge".
29 30 31 32 33	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent to his wife, Polly Lawrence; his children Anne Lawrence and Scott Lawrence; his siblings Barbara Jo Hadley and William Roger Lawrence; Lawrence Construction; Greg Rees, designer of Bronco Bridge; the City of Trinidad; the Las Animas County Commissioners, the Colorado
