SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 17-018	
CONCERNING RECOGNIZING THE SPECIAL RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE	
UNITED KINGDOM AND COLORADO.	
WHEREAS, The United States and the United Kingdom are	
brought together by our close linguistic, historic, cultural, and political ties and these strong bonds make us natural, resilient, and strong partners	
and allies in the global community; and	
WHEREAS, The United States and the United Kingdom draw	
inspiration from common values: Open government, free speech, and	
open markets; and	
WHEREAS, The Magna Carta, created in 1215 in England,	
established the basis for protecting individual freedoms and strongly	
influenced the development of the United States Constitution, the Bill of	

1 .	Rights, and the Colorado Constitution; and
4 5	WHEREAS, The United States is Britain's largest single trading partner and the United Kingdom's top export destination. The United States remains by far the United Kingdom's largest inward investor. This partnership worth over \$200 billion a year has created a million jobs on both sides of the Atlantic; and
9 10	WHEREAS, The United Kingdom-United States economic relationship is exceptionally strong in Colorado, where the United Kingdom is the state's largest foreign direct investor, having created over 14,000 jobs, and the United Kingdom also ranks in the top ten export markets for Colorado goods and services; and
14	WHEREAS, Numerous Colorado-based companies are investors in the United Kingdom, including many of the state's Fortune 500 companies, as well as its small and medium size companies, in industries ranging from infrastructure to technology to food and beverage; and
18 19	WHEREAS, The United States and the United Kingdom have been historic and consistent partners in matters of international security. As close allies in NATO, permanent members of the United Nations Security Council, and leading nuclear powers, the United States-United Kingdom partnership has been a model of global security for over 70 years; and
23 24	WHEREAS, Today, United States and United Kingdom troops equip, train, fight, and recuperate together. Several hundred United Kingdom personnel are stationed in the United States, including many British military officers working alongside United States military at Colorado's military bases; and
28 29	WHEREAS, United States-United Kingdom research partnerships remain critical, with collaborations resulting in 26 Nobel prizes for science and economics. Most recently, United Kingdom-Colorado research collaboration has focused on innovation in renewable energy and in the "Internet of Things"; and
33 34	WHEREAS, The United States and the United Kingdom continue to build stronger academic ties, with every year roughly 50,000 American students studying in the United Kingdom, and around 11,000 British students studying in the United States, and Colorado's higher education institutions are significant contributors to this relationship; and

1	WHEREAS, The United Kingdom and United States continue to
2	influence one another through excellence in film, music, fine art, and
3	literature, all of which has been on display in Colorado's various arts and
4	cultural venues, including the Denver Art Museum and the Colorado
5	Shakespeare Festival; and
6	WHEREAS, The United Kingdom views Colorado as a key
7	partner and has established a permanent presence in the state through its
8	United Kingdom Government Office, which seeks to build and strengthen
9	business, economic, political, and research ties between Colorado and the
10	United Kingdom; now, therefore,
11	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly
12	of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
13	That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly,
14	officially recognize, honor, and celebrate the special relationship between
15	the United Kingdom and Colorado, which is built upon a strong
16	foundation of business, economic, political, academic, research, cultural,
17	and historic ties.
18	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent
19	to Governor John Hickenlooper, Colorado's Congressional Delegation,
20	Mayor Michael Hancock, the British Embassy in Washington, D.C., the
21	British Consulate-General in Chicago, the United Kingdom Government
22	Office in Denver, the World Trade Center Denver, Broomfield Sister
23	Cities, City of Evans Sister Cities, Greeley Sister Cities, Center for
24	British and Irish Studies at the University of Colorado, and the British
25	Motorcycle Association of Colorado.
