- Colorado works every day to help children and adults with intellectual
 and developmental disabilities, their families, and other advocates to
 improve the service delivery system; and
- WHEREAS, The Arc believes people with intellectual and developmental disabilities are defined by their strengths, abilities, and inherent value and not by their disabilities; and
- WHEREAS, The Arc believes people with intellectual and
 developmental disabilities belong in the community and have
 fundamental moral, civil, and constitutional rights to be fully included
 and to actively participate in all aspects of society; and
- WHEREAS, The Arc knows that people with intellectual and
 developmental disabilities, with appropriate resources and supports, can
 make decisions about their own lives and must be heard on issues
 affecting their lives; and
- WHEREAS, The Arc is committed to working with the Colorado General Assembly, the administration, and state agencies as well as all partners providing advocacy, services, and support for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities to increase resources and improve systems so that people can live productive, healthy lives in the community; now, therefore,
