	SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 17-023
01	CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF MARCH 22, 2017, AS "COLORADO
02	AGRICULTURE DAY".
1	WHEREAS, Americans enjoy the safest, most abundant, and most
2	affordable food supply in the world, thanks largely to the efficiency and
3	productivity of America's farm and ranch families; and
4	WHEREAS, Worldwide demand for food is expected to double by
5	2050 as the world's population expands from the current 7.5 billion to 9.5
6	billion, challenging farmers and ranchers to produce more food, feed,
7	fiber, and fuel; and
8	WHEREAS, Today, 99% of U.S. farms and ranches are operated
9	by families, and each feeds an estimated 168 people, a dramatic increase
10	from the 1960s, when each farmer could feed only 25 people; and

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, Americans spend less than 7% of their annual income on food, less than any other developed nation, while American farmers and ranchers receive on average only about 16 cents of every dollar spent on food; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, American farmers and ranchers are the most capable and responsible providers for the safety, health, and well-being of their livestock; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, Agriculture ranks among the most important economic sectors in Colorado, supporting more than 170,000 jobs and generating an estimated \$41 billion of economic activity annually; and
11 12 13	WHEREAS, Exports of Colorado food and agricultural products have more than tripled in the past 20 years and totaled \$1.7 billion in 2016; and
14 15	WHEREAS, Colorado agriculture contributes to national security not only by providing food and fiber, but also by producing energy; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, Colorado recognizes landowners whose livelihood depends upon the property they reside on, operate on, and care for as they work to provide basic necessities to all; and
19 20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, Leadership is vital to the viability of the agriculture industry, and participants in programs like the National FFA Organization, 4-H, and the Colorado Agricultural Leadership Program help develop those leadership skills necessary to promote agriculture and educate their urban cousins on the importance of agriculture to the world; and
25 26	WHEREAS, Colorado's agriculture industry requires an adequate, reliable workforce in order to provide food from the field to the table; and
27 28 29	WHEREAS, Colorado's farms and ranches provide wildlife habitat, open space, and a site for innovative and sustainable farming practices that ensure the protection of state resources; and
30 31 32	WHEREAS, Colorado's agricultural producers provide a diverse and valuable array of livestock and crops, including cattle, dairy, sheep, hogs horses goats bison elk poultry and eggs and aquaculture as well

1 2 3 4	as field corn, sweet corn, wheat, hay, potatoes, barley, sorghum, sunflowers, dry beans, soybeans, onions, carrots, wine grapes, fruit, numerous other vegetables, honey, and greenhouse and nursery products; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, Colorado's agriculturists employ sound animal husbandry practices, ensuring that livestock remain healthy, productive, and content; and
8 9	WHEREAS, Colorado agriculture provides an estimated \$67.5 million annually to support the state's wildlife; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, Colorado's farmers and ranchers are innovative entrepreneurs and business leaders who remain resilient in their dedication to the continued prosperity of the state's agriculture; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, The protection of private property and the rights of landowners who provide wholesome, safe food to Americans and others worldwide is essential; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, Farmers and ranchers are critical to Colorado agritourism, welcoming tourists from around the world and showing them all Colorado has to offer; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS, Losing agricultural land and water to other uses will result in overall negative impacts to the state's economy and a loss of food production vital to all Coloradans; and
22 23 24	WHEREAS, The United States' national security is stronger because farmers provide more than enough food to keep this country from depending on other nations for sustenance; and
25 26	WHEREAS, March21, 2017, is "National Agriculture Day"; now, therefore,
27 28	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
29 30 31 32	That we, the members of the General Assembly, proudly recognize and designate "Colorado Agriculture Day" on March 22, 2017, in celebration of the many men and women who strengthen the nation's agriculture industry; promote a safe, high-quality, and sustainable food
