SENATE RESOLUTION 18-003 101 CONCERNING THE EXPULSION OF SENATOR RANDY L. BAUMGARDNER 102 FOR SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF A LEGISLATIVE EMPLOYEE. 1 WHEREAS, On November 28, 2017, a former Legislative Aide at 2 the Colorado General Assembly filed a formal complaint alleging that 3 Senator Randy L. Baumgardner had grabbed and slapped her buttocks on 4 four separate occasions during the 2016 Legislative Session; and 5 WHEREAS, Pursuant to Rule 38 of the Joint Rules of the Senate and the House of Representatives, the General Assembly has in place a 6 workplace harassment policy that is binding on all members of the 7 8 General Assembly; and 9 WHEREAS, That workplace harassment policy prohibits physical conduct of a sexual nature, which includes, among other things, patting, 10 pinching, or intentionally brushing against the body of a member, a 11 12 legislative employee, or a third party; and 13 WHEREAS, Pursuant to the workplace harassment policy, after a 14 formal complaint has been made the contact person with whom a

complaint is filed may, at the contact person's discretion, elect to use an

I	independent third party to investigate the complaint; and
2 3 4 5	WHEREAS, The Secretary of the Senate, acting under her authority as the contact person with whom the complain was filed, selected Employer's Council, a private organization made up of and funded by employers, to investigate the complaint; and
6	WHEREAS, The Employer's Council conducted a full
7	investigation between December 4, 2017, and January 18, 2018, during
8	which the Employer's Council interviewed four individuals, including
9	Senator Baumgardner, in regard to the formal complaint; and
10	WHEREAS, The Employer's Council concluded that the victim's
11	complaint was credible and that Senator Baumgardner, more likely than
12	not, grabbed and slapped the victim's buttocks on several occasions
13	during the 2016 Legislative Session; and
14	WHEREAS, The workplace harassment policy also prohibits
15	verbal conduct of a sexual nature, including, among other things, sexual
16	comments or innuendoes about a person's clothing, body, or sexual
17	activity; and
18	WHEREAS, The Employer's Council investigation also revealed
19	an unprofessional pattern of behavior by Senator Baumgardner, including
20	inappropriate comments made in the workplace such as "you look
21	extremely sexy today"; and
22	WHEREAS, Senator Baumgardner's verbal and physical conduct
23	constituted sexual harassment because it was of a sexual nature and had
24	the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's
25	work performance and creating an intimidating, hostile, and offensive
26	working environment in violation of the workplace harassment policy in
27	place pursuant to Joint Rule 38; and
28	WHEREAS, The Senate finds that the members of the Senate
29	should conduct themselves in accordance with the highest moral, ethical,
30	and legal standards in their official duties and in their public and private
31	lives; and
32	WHEREAS, The Senate finds that members and legislative
33	employees of the Colorado General Assembly, and third parties who work
34	with the General Assembly have an inalienable right to enjoy a

1	workplace free from harassment; and
2 3 4	WHEREAS, The Senate finds that while all sexual harassment is unacceptable, sexual harassment against a legislative employee is especially reprehensible because of the inherent power dynamics; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, The Senate finds that Senator Randy L. Baumgardner behaved inappropriately and in a manner incompatible with the high standards and dignity of the Senate; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, The Senate finds that the conduct of Senator Randy L. Baumgardner has failed to uphold the honor and dignity of the Senate and reflects poorly upon the State of Colorado and its citizens; and
11 12 13	WHEREAS, The Senate finds that Senator Randy L. Baumgardner has failed to acknowledge any wrongdoing or accept responsibility for his behavior during the 2016 Legislative Session; and
14 15 16	WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 12 of Article V of the Colorado Constitution the Senate may expel one of its members by a two-thirds vote of all senators; and
17 18	WHEREAS, Senator Randy L. Baumgardner's behavior rises to the level where expulsion is the only just remedy; now, therefore,
19 20	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
21 22	That Senator Randy L. Baumgardner is hereby expelled from the Senate for just cause and that his seat is hereby declared vacant.
23 24	Be It Further Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate print this Resolution in its entirety in the Senate Journal.
