"AN ACT CONCERNING FUEL VENDOR REIMBURSEMENT UNDER THE LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, A COMMON HEATING ASSISTANCE APPLICATION, AND STUDIES REGARDING BULK FUEL PURCHASES AND VENDOR PAYMENT BEST PRACTICES."

- Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following in lieu thereof:
- 3 "Section 1. (Effective from passage) (a) The Commissioner of Social
- 4 Services shall convene a working group to study best practices utilized
- 5 in other states to fairly compensate deliverable fuel vendors
- 6 participating in energy assistance programs while maintaining the
- 7 maximum amount of funding to benefit recipients of such programs.
- 8 The study shall include, but need not be limited to, the benefits and
- 9 drawbacks of bulk state purchases of deliverable fuel for the state
- 10 energy assistance program.
- 11 (b) The working group shall consist of: (1) A member of an
- 12 organization representing deliverable fuel vendors in the state, (2) a

representative of a community action agency that contracts with the commissioner to administer the state energy assistance program funded under the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Act of 1981, as amended from time to time, (3) a representative from the Department of Administrative Services, (4) an individual who represents the interests and financial concerns of recipients of energy assistance provided under the state energy assistance program, and (5) a representative from the Office of the Consumer Counsel.

(c) Not later than January 31, 2025, the commissioner shall submit a report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations, energy and technology and human services on the results of the working group's study.

Sec. 2. (Effective from passage) The Commissioner of Social Services, in consultation with the Low Income Energy Advisory Board, established pursuant to section 16a-41b of the general statutes, shall study the feasibility of developing a common application and benefits portal for use by applicants for (1) low-income home energy assistance benefits administered pursuant to section 16a-41a of the general statutes, and (2) Operation Fuel, Incorporated. Not later than July 1, 2025, the commissioner shall submit a report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to energy and technology and human services on the results of the study, including, but not limited to, costs and benefits of such common application and benefits portal."
