"AN ACT PROHIBITING THE USE OF CERTAIN RODENTICIDES FOR THE PROTECTION OF HAWKS, RAPTORS AND OTHER WILDLIFE."

- Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
- 2 following in lieu thereof:
- 3 "Section 1. (NEW) (Effective October 1, 2022) (a) For purposes of this
- 4 section, "second-generation anticoagulant rodenticide" means any
- 5 pesticide product containing any of the following active ingredients: (1)
- 6 brodifacoum; (2) bromadiolone; (3) difenacoum; or (4) difethialone.
- 7 (b) No person shall use, apply, sell or distribute any second-8 generation anticoagulant rodenticide in this state.
- 9 (c) The provisions of subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to 10 any of the following uses or locations:
- 11 (1) The use of second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides for 12 public health activities in accordance with any provision of the Public

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- 13 Health Code;
- 14 (2) The use of second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides for the
- 15 purposes of protecting water supply infrastructure and facilities in a
- 16 manner that is consistent with all otherwise applicable federal and state
- 17 laws and regulations;
- 18 (3) The use of any registered second-generation anticoagulant
- 19 rodenticide to control an actual or potential rodent infestation
- 20 associated with a public health need, as determined by a supporting
- 21 declaration from the Commissioner of Public Health or a director of
- 22 health. For purposes of this subdivision, "public health need" means an
- 23 urgent, nonroutine situation posing a significant risk to human health
- 24 in which it is documented that other rodent control alternatives,
- 25 including nonchemical alternatives, are inadequate to control the rodent
- 26 infestation;
- 27 (4) A medical waste generator;
- 28 (5) Any facility registered annually and subject to inspection under
- 29 Section 510 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, 21 USC 360 et
- 30 seq. and that is compliant with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and
- 31 Rodenticide Act, 7 USC 135 et seq.;
- 32 (6) Agricultural activity. For purposes of this subdivision,
- 33 "agricultural activity" additionally includes activities conducted in any
- 34 of the following locations:
- 35 (A) A warehouse used to store foods for human or animal
- 36 consumption;
- 37 (B) An agricultural food production site, including, but not limited
- 38 to, a slaughterhouse or cannery;
- 39 (C) A factory, brewery or winery;
- 40 (D) An agricultural production site housing water storage and
- 41 conveyance facilities; or

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42 (E) An agricultural production site housing rights-of-way and other 43 transportation infrastructure.

- (d) The Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection may adopt regulations, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the general statutes and this section, to ensure that the continued use of second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides is not reasonably expected to result in significant adverse effects to nontarget wildlife. Such regulations shall include, but not be limited to, provisions for the use of such rodenticides if the eradication of invasive rodent populations is necessary for the protection of threatened or endangered species or the habitats of such species.
- (e) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (b) of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than five thousand dollars by the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Section 1 October 1, 2022 New section

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
