## **OFA Fiscal Note**

## Minimal Fiscal Impact

The amendment expands (1) the circumstances under which a death can be classified as in the line of duty, and (2) the provisions of the bill to include emergency medical services (EMS) personnel. This results in a minimal increase to the fiscal impacts identified in the underlying bill.<sup>1,2</sup>
