The amendment strikes the language in the underlying bill and the associated fiscal impact.

The amendment, which requires the Department of Social Services (DSS) to conduct studies related to low-income home energy assistance, is not anticipated to result in a fiscal impact to the state. The studies address (1) fuel vendor compensation and program benefits, and (2) developing a common application and benefits portal for use by applicants for low-income home energy assistance and Operation Fuel.
