AN ACT CONCERNING COMPENSATION OF INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. Section 18-85 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2023*):
- 3 (a) The Commissioner of Correction, after consultation with the
- 4 Commissioner of Administrative Services and the Secretary of the Office
- 5 of Policy and Management, shall establish a schedule of compensation
- 6 for services performed on behalf of the state by inmates of any
- 7 institution or facility of the department. Such schedule shall (1)
- 8 recognize degrees of merit, diligence and skill in order to encourage
- 9 inmate incentive and industry, and (2) establish a pay range of (A) not
- 10 less than five, but no greater than ten dollars per week, and (B) for any
- 11 position requiring specialized skills or training, not less than thirty-five
- 12 <u>dollars per week</u>.
- 13 (b) Compensation so earned shall be deposited, under the direction
- 14 of the Commissioner of Correction, in an account in a savings bank or
- 15 state bank and trust company in this state or an account administered

by the State Treasurer. Any compensation so earned shall be paid to the 16 17 inmate on the inmate's release from incarceration in the form of a debit 18 card, except that the commissioner may, while the inmate is in custody, 19 disburse any compensation earned by such inmate in accordance with 20 the following priorities: (1) Federal taxes due; (2) restitution or payment 21 of compensation to a crime victim ordered by any court of competent 22 jurisdiction; (3) payment of a civil judgment rendered in favor of a crime 23 victim by any court of competent jurisdiction; (4) victims compensation 24 through the criminal injuries account administered by the Office of 25 Victim Services; (5) state taxes due; (6) support of the inmate's 26 dependents, if any; (7) the inmate's necessary travel expense to and from 27 work and other incidental expenses; (8) costs of such inmate's 28 incarceration under section 18-85a and regulations adopted in 29 accordance with said section; and (9) payment to the clerk of the court 30 in which an inmate, confined in a correctional facility only for payment 31 of a fine, was convicted, such portion of such compensation as is 32 necessary to pay such fine. Any interest that accrues shall be credited to 33 any institutional fund established for the welfare of inmates. 34 Compensation under this section shall be in addition to any 35 compensation received or credited under section 18-50.
