## AN ACT RAISING THE PERSONAL NEEDS ALLOWANCE FOR CERTAIN RESIDENTS OF LONG-TERM CARE INSTITUTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 17b-106 of the 2020 supplement to

the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
thereof (*Effective July 1, 2020*):

4 (b) [Effective July 1, 2011, the] <u>The</u> commissioner shall provide a state 5 supplement payment for recipients of Medicaid and the federal 6 Supplemental Security Income Program who reside in long-term care 7 facilities sufficient to increase their personal needs allowance to [sixty] 8 <u>seventy-two</u> dollars per month. Such state supplement payment shall be 9 made to the long-term care facility to be deposited into the personal 10 fund account of each such recipient. For the purposes of this subsection, 11 "long-term care facility" means a licensed chronic and convalescent 12 nursing home, a chronic disease hospital, a rest home with nursing 13 supervision, an intermediate care facility for individuals with 14 intellectual disabilities or a state humane institution.

- 17 [Effective July 1, 2011, the] <u>The</u> Commissioner of Social Services shall 18 permit patients residing in nursing homes, chronic disease hospitals and 19 state humane institutions who are medical assistance recipients under 20 sections 17b-260 to 17b-262, inclusive, 17b-264 to 17b-285, inclusive, and 21 17b-357 to 17b-361, inclusive, to have a monthly personal fund 22 allowance of [sixty] <u>seventy-two</u> dollars.
