Substitute Bill No. 5193

AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF RENT INCREASES, FEE INCREASES AND CHANGES IN RESIDENCY STATUS AT MANAGED RESIDENTIAL COMMUNITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a working 2 group to study the following issues involving a managed residential 3 community, as defined in section 19a-693 of the general statutes, that is 4 not affiliated with a facility providing services under a continuing-care 5 contract, as defined in section 17b-520 of the general statutes: (1) What notice should be provided to residents of managed residential 6 7 communities of rental and other fee increases that exceed certain 8 percentages, and (2) resident health transitions and determinations of 9 care levels. Members of the working group shall include, but not be limited to, representatives of the (A) Connecticut Assisted Living 10 11 Association, (B) Connecticut Association of Health Care Facilities -12 Connecticut Centers of Assisted Living, (C) LeadingAge Connecticut, 13 and (D) the Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman.

(b) Chairpersons of the working group shall be a representative of the
Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman and another member of the
working group chosen by members of the group. The representative of
the Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman shall schedule the first

18 meeting of the working group not later than sixty days after the effective 19 date of this section. The administrative staff of the joint standing 20 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters 21 relating to aging shall serve as administrative staff of the working 22 group.

(c) Not later than December 31, 2022, the working group shall submit
a report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing
committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
relating to aging in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of
the general statutes. The working group shall terminate on the date that
it submits such report or December 31, 2022, whichever is later.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
