## AN ACT CONCERNING PAYMENTS TO PROVIDERS OF SOCIAL SERVICES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 4-216 of the 2020 supplement to
- 2 the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
- 3 thereof (*Effective July 1, 2020*):

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(c) The secretary shall establish [a pilot] <u>an</u> incentive program for nonprofit providers of human services that shall (1) allow providers who otherwise meet contractual requirements to retain [a percentage of] any savings realized by the providers from the contracted cost for services, and (2) provide that future contracted amounts from the state for the same types of services are not reduced solely to reflect savings achieved in previous contracts by such providers. [The pilot incentive program shall include eight nonprofit providers of human services with state contracts of the following amounts: (A) Two with contracts of at least fifty million dollars, (B) two with contracts of at least twenty million dollars but less than fifty million dollars, (C) two with contracts

of at least five million dollars but less than twenty million dollars, and

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- 16 (D) two with contracts of less than five million dollars.] For purposes of 17 this subsection, "nonprofit providers of human services" includes, but is
- not limited to, nonprofit providers of services to persons with
- 19 intellectual, physical or mental disabilities or autism spectrum disorder.
  - Sec. 2. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2020*) The Commissioner of Social Services shall amend the Medicaid state plan to integrate services provided by peer support specialists into the medical assistance program and provide Medicaid reimbursement for such services. For purposes of this section, "peer support services" means a recovery-focused behavioral health service that allows an individual the opportunity to learn to manage his or her recovery with help from a peer support specialist who may have experience recovering from mental illness or substance use disorder.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
