***AN ACT CONCERNING THE MOTOR VEHICLE MILL RATE AND  
MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED OUT OF STATE.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 12-71e of the general statutes is  
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*  
3 *1, 2020, and applicable to assessment years commencing on and after October*  
4 *1, 2020*):

5 (b) [Any] To comply with the provisions of this section, any  
6 municipality or district may establish a mill rate for motor vehicles,  
7 including, but not limited to, motor vehicles subject to property tax in  
8 this state pursuant to subsection (g) of section 12-71b, that is different  
9 from its mill rate for real property and personal property other than  
10 motor vehicles [to comply with the provisions of this section]. No  
11 district or borough may set a motor vehicle mill rate that if combined  
12 with the motor vehicle mill rate of the town, city, consolidated town and  
13 city or consolidated town and borough in which such district or  
14 borough is located would result in a combined motor vehicle mill rate  
15 (1) above 39 mills for the assessment year commencing October 1, 2016,

16 or (2) above 45 mills for the assessment year commencing October 1,  
17 2017, and each assessment year thereafter.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	<i>October 1, 2020, and applicable to assessment years commencing on and after October 1, 2020</i>	12-71e(b)

**Statement of Purpose:**

To permit municipalities to establish a mill rate for certain motor vehicles that are not registered in this state but that are statutorily subject to property tax in this state.
