AN ACT REQUIRING FIREARM INCIDENT REPORTS FROM POLICE OFFICERS AND ANNUAL REPORTS OF SUCH DATA BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY SERVICES AND PUBLIC PROTECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2023*) (a) A police officer, as defined in section 7-294a of the general statutes, who responds to an alleged crime or a fatality involving a firearm, as defined in section 53a-3 of the general statutes, shall complete a firearm incident report, whether or not an arrest occurs.

6 (b) Each law enforcement unit, as defined in section 7-294a of the 7 general statutes, shall send all firearm incident reports to the 8 Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection, who shall 9 compile statistics of firearm incidents and cause them to be published 10 annually in the Connecticut Uniform Crime Reports, pursuant to section 29-1c of the general statutes. An offense shall be counted for each 11 12 incident reported to the police. A zero shall be reported if no incidents 13 have occurred during the reporting periods.

14 (c) For the purpose of establishing accurate data on the extent and

15 severity of firearm incidents in the state, the Commissioner of 16 Emergency Services and Public Protection shall prescribe a form for 17 making firearm incident reports. The form shall include, but is not 18 limited to, the following: (1) Name of the individual or individuals 19 involved in the alleged crime or fatality; (2) location, time and date of 20 the incident; (3) number and identification of firearms involved; (4) 21 whether the alleged crime or fatality was committed by a person who 22 had a prior conviction that prohibited such person from legally 23 possessing the firearm; (5) whether the alleged crime or fatality was 24 committed with an illegally possessed or unregistered firearm; and (6) 25 any other data that may be necessary for a complete analysis of all 26 circumstances of firearm incidents in the state.

(d) A copy of the firearm incident report shall be forwarded to the
state's attorney for the appropriate judicial district in cases where an
arrest has been made.

(e) Not later than January 1, 2025, and annually thereafter, the
Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection shall tabulate
and compile data from the firearm incident reports and report such
compilation, to the Governor and the joint standing committee of the
General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public safety
and security, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the
general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
