AN ACT REQUIRING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO STUDY THIRD-PARTY HEALTH INSURANCE AND MEDICARE MARKETING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (Effective from passage) (a) The Insurance Commissioner
- 2 shall study the marketing practices of entities, other than insurers,
- 3 insurance agents and insurance producers licensed in this state, that
- 4 generate revenue from referral fees paid to such entities based on
- 5 Medicare-related and health insurance leads generated in this state.
- 6 (b) Not later than January 1, 2021, the Insurance Commissioner shall
- 7 submit a report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the
- 8 general statutes, on the commissioner's findings to the joint standing
- 9 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
- 10 relating to insurance.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Section 1 from passage New section

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Statement of Purpose:

To require the Insurance Commissioner to study the marketing practices of third parties that generate revenue from referral fees paid to such entities based on Medicare-related and health insurance leads generated in this state.
