## AN ACT PERMITTING A SCHOOL DISTRICT TO PAY TUITION FOR SENDING ITS ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS TO ANOTHER DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Section 10-33 of the general statutes is repealed and the
- 2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2020*):
- 3 Any local board of education which does not maintain a [high school]
- 4 school in which instruction is offered for grades kindergarten to twelve,
- 5 <u>inclusive</u>, or any combination of such grades, shall designate a [high]
- 6 school in another school district approved by the State Board of
- 7 Education as the school which any child <u>under the jurisdiction of such</u>
- 8 board may attend, [who has completed an elementary school course,]
- 9 and such board of education shall pay to such other school district the
- tuition of such child [residing with a parent or guardian in such school
- district and attending such high school to attend school in such other
- 12 district.
- 13 Sec. 2. Subdivision (3) of subsection (a) of section 10-262j of the 2020
- 14 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is

substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2020*):

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- 16 (3) Any district (A) that [does not maintain a high school and] pays 17 tuition to another school district pursuant to section 10-33, as amended 18 by this act, for resident students to attend [high] school in another 19 district, and (B) in which the number of resident students attending high 20 school for such district for October 1, 2018, using the data of record as 21 of January 31, 2019, is lower than such district's number of resident 22 students attending high school for October 1, 2017, using the data of 23 record as of January 31, 2019, may reduce such district's budgeted 24 appropriation for education by the difference in the number of resident 25 students attending high school for such years multiplied by the amount 26 of tuition paid per student pursuant to section 10-33, as amended by this 27 act; or
- Sec. 3. Subdivision (3) of subsection (b) of section 10-262j of the 2020 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2020*):
  - (3) Any district (A) that [does not maintain a high school and] pays tuition to another school district pursuant to section 10-33, as amended by this act, for resident students to attend [high] school in another district, and (B) in which the number of resident students attending high school for such district for October 1, 2019, using the data of record as of January 31, 2020, is lower than such district's number of resident students attending high school for October 1, 2018, using the data of record as of January 31, 2020, may reduce such district's budgeted appropriation for education by the difference in the number of resident students attending high school for such years multiplied by the amount of tuition paid per student pursuant to section 10-33, as amended by this act; or
- Sec. 4. Subsection (j) of section 10-266aa of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*, 2020):
  - (j) Nothing in this section shall prohibit school districts from charging

- 47 tuition to other school districts [that do not have a high school] pursuant
- 48 to section 10-33, as amended by this act.
