## AN ACT CONCERNING THE SUPERSEDENCE OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS AND THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (e) of section 5-278 of the general statutes is
- 2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (Effective July 1,

- 4 (e) [Where] (1) Except as provided in subdivision (2) of this

- of any employees in a retirement system is effected by such agreement
- or arbitration award, the effective date of participation in said system,

- month in which a certified copy of such agreement or arbitration award
- 16 is received by the Retirement Commission or such later date as may be
- 17 specified in the agreement or arbitration award.
- 18 (2) For any agreement or arbitration award approved on or after July
- 19 1, 2020, in accordance with the provisions of sections 5-270 to 5-280,
- 20 <u>inclusive</u>, on matters appropriate to collective bargaining, as defined in
- 21 <u>said sections, where there is a conflict between a provision of any such</u>
- 22 <u>agreement or award and the provisions of the Freedom of Information</u>
- 23 Act, as defined in section 1-200, the provisions of the Freedom of
- 24 Information Act shall prevail.
