AN ACT CONCERNING NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 17b-276 of the general statutes is
repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*, 2024):

4 (a) The Commissioner of Social Services shall identify geographic 5 areas of the state where competitive bidding for nonemergency 6 transportation services provided to medical assistance recipients to 7 access covered medical services would result in cost savings to the state. 8 For the identified areas, the Commissioner of Social Services, in 9 consultation with the Commissioner of Transportation, the 10 Commissioner of Public Health and the Secretary of the Office of Policy 11 and Management, shall purchase such nonemergency transportation 12 services through a competitive bidding process. Any transportation 13 providers awarded a contract or subcontract for the direct provision of 14 such services shall meet state licensure or certification requirements and 15 the nonemergency transportation requirements established by the

16 Department of Social Services, and shall provide the most cost effective 17 transportation service, provided any contractor awarded a contract 18 solely for coordinating such transportation services shall not be required 19 to meet such licensure or certification requirements and provided the 20 first such contracts for the purchase of such services shall not exceed one 21 year. Any drivers providing services under such contract shall at a 22 minimum have approval by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles for state endorsement requirements pursuant to section 14-44. Prior to 23 24 awarding a contract pursuant to this section, the Commissioner of Social 25 Services shall consider the effect of the contract on the emergency 26 ambulance primary service areas and volunteer ambulance services 27 affected by the contract. The commissioner may limit the geographic 28 areas to be served by a contractor and may limit the amount of services 29 to be performed by a contractor. The commissioner may operate one or 30 more pilot programs prior to state-wide operation of a competitive 31 bidding program for nonemergency transportation services. By 32 enrolling in the Medicaid program or participating in the competitively 33 bid contract for nonemergency transportation services, providers of 34 nonemergency transportation services agree to offer to recipients of 35 medical assistance all types or levels of transportation services for which 36 they are licensed or certified. Effective October 1, 1991, payment for such 37 services shall be made only for services provided to an eligible recipient 38 who is actually transported. A contract entered into pursuant to this 39 section may include services provided by another state agency. 40 Notwithstanding any provision of the general statutes, a contract 41 entered into pursuant to this section shall establish the rates to be paid 42 for the transportation services provided under the contract. A contract 43 entered into pursuant to this section may include services provided by 44 another state agency and shall supersede any conflicting provisions of 45 the regulations of Connecticut state agencies pertaining to medical 46 transportation services. Any contractor awarded a contract for 47 coordinating nonemergency transportation services for medical 48 assistance recipients, who also coordinates transportation services for 49 nonmedical assistance recipients, shall disclose to any transportation 50 provider, with whom it subcontracts to provide nonemergency

- 51 transportation services under this section, the source of payment at the
- 52 time the service is requested.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

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Statement of Purpose:

To require drivers providing nonemergency medical transportation to be licensed operators of motor vehicles used for passenger transportation.
