## Substitute Bill No. 5481

January Session, 2021



## AN ACT ESTABLISHING A GRANT PROGRAM FOR WOMEN AND MINORITY-OWNED BUSINESSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) (a) As used in this section:
- 2 (1) "COVID-19" means the respiratory disease designated by the
- World Health Organization on February 11, 2020, as coronavirus 2019,
- 4 and any related mutation thereof recognized by said organization as a
- 5 communicable respiratory disease;
- 6 (2) "Minority-owned business" means a minority business enterprise 7 as defined in section 4a-60g of the general statutes;
- 8 (3) "Program" means the women-owned and minority-owned 9 business grant program established pursuant to this section; and
- 10 (4) "Women-owned business" means any business of which fifty-one
- 11 per cent or more of the capital stock, if any, or assets are owned by a
- woman or women who are active in the daily affairs of the business and
- 13 have the power to direct the management and policies of the business.
- 14 (b) The Department of Economic and Community Development shall
- 15 establish a women-owned and minority-owned business grant
- 16 program. The purpose of such program shall be to provide grants to

- 17 women-owned and minority-owned businesses that were established
- during or adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, as determined
- 19 by the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development. The
- 20 department may enter into an agreement, pursuant to chapter 55a of the
- 21 general statutes, with a person, firm, corporation or other entity to
- 22 operate such program.
- 23 (c) The Department of Economic and Community Development shall
- 24 publish on its Internet web site a notice of grant availability for the
- 25 period beginning on the effective date of this section and ending on June
- 26 30, 2022.
- 27 (d) Each women-owned or minority-owned business applying for a
- 28 grant under this section shall submit an application in such form and
- 29 manner as prescribed by the commissioner. Each application shall
- include the following information: (1) The location of the principal place
- of business of the applicant; (2) the ownership structure of the women-
- 32 owned or minority-owned business; (3) an explanation of the intended
- use of the grant being applied for; and (4) such other information that
- 34 the commissioner deems necessary.
- 35 (e) The Department of Economic and Community Development shall
- 36 review all grant applications received under the program and determine
- 37 which applications are eligible for funding. Criteria for such
- determinations shall be established by the department and included in
- 39 the notice of grant availability described in subsection (c) of this section.
- 40 (f) The amount of any grant issued pursuant to this section shall not
- 41 exceed twenty-five thousand dollars and the total amount of grants
- 42 issued shall not exceed five million dollars. No grant shall be issued
- 43 pursuant to this section after June 30, 2022.
- 44 (g) (1) Not later than January 1, 2022, the Commissioner of Economic
- 45 and Community Development shall report, in accordance with the
- 46 provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing
- 47 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters

relating to commerce regarding the progress of the program and including any requisite legislative proposals to accomplish the goals of the program.

(2) Not later than January 1, 2023, the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development shall report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to commerce. Such report shall include the following data regarding the program: (A) The number of grants provided and the amount of such grants; (B) the identities of the businesses that received such grants, and information regarding whether such businesses were women-owned or minority-owned; (C) the intended use of each grant provided, as described by the business pursuant to subdivision (3) of subsection (e) of this section; (D) the number of employees employed by each business that received a grant at the time such business received business that received a grant at the conclusion of the program.

65 Sec. 2. (Effective from passage) The Secretary of the Office of Policy and 66 Management shall allocate five million dollars to the Department of 67 Economic and Community Development, from the federal funds 68 received by the state pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and 69 Economic Security Act, P.L. 116-136, as amended from time to time, the 70 Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 71 P.L. 116-260, as amended from time to time, or the American Rescue 72 Plan Act of 2021, P.L. 117-2, as amended from time to time, for the 73 purposes of the program established pursuant to section 1 of this act.
