AN ACT CONCERNING SECONDHAND DEALERS, PRECIOUS METALS OR STONE DEALERS AND THE SALE AND DISPOSITION OF PRECIOUS METALS AND STONES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (f) of section 21-47e of the general statutes is
- 2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*
- 3 1, 2020):
- 4 (f) (1) Any secondhand dealer who was licensed in any city or town
- 5 as a pawnbroker pursuant to section 21-40 on March 31, 2011, and who
- 6 continues to hold such license, may pay for property received pursuant
- 7 to a secondhand dealer license issued in accordance with section 21-47d
- 8 in the manner authorized under section 21-42, [until July 1, 2021,]
- 9 provided such secondhand dealer complies with all other provisions of
- 10 this section relating to secondhand dealers.
- 11 (2) Any secondhand dealer who holds a license in any city or town as
- 12 <u>a pawnbroker pursuant to section 21-40 for a period of three years and</u>
- 13 such license was not suspended or revoked during such time period,
- and who continues to hold such license, may pay for property received

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- 15 pursuant to a secondhand dealer license issued in accordance with
- section 21-47d in the manner authorized under section 21-42, provided
- 17 <u>such secondhand dealer complies with all other provisions of this</u>
- 18 section relating to secondhand dealers.
- 19 Sec. 2. Subsection (i) of section 21-100 of the general statutes is
- 20 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*
- 21 1, 2020):
- 22 (i) (1) Any precious metals or stones dealer who was licensed in any
- 23 city or town as a pawnbroker pursuant to section 21-40 on March 31,
- 24 2011, and who continues to hold such license, may pay for property
- 25 received pursuant to a precious metals or stones dealer license issued in
- 26 accordance with this section in the manner authorized under section 21-
- 42, [until July 1, 2021,] provided such precious metals or stones dealer
- 28 complies with all other provisions of this section relating to precious
- 29 metals or stones dealers.
- 30 (2) Any precious metals or stones dealer who holds a license in any
- 31 city or town as a pawnbroker pursuant to section 21-40 for a period of
- 32 three years and such license was not suspended or revoked during such
- 33 time period, and who continues to hold such license, may pay for
- 34 property received pursuant to a precious metals or stones dealer license
- 35 <u>issued in accordance with this section in the manner authorized under</u>
- 36 <u>section 21-42, provided such precious metals or stones dealer complies</u>
- 37 with all other provisions of this section relating to precious metals or
- 38 stones dealers.
- 39 Sec. 3. Subsection (1) of section 21-100 of the general statutes is
- 40 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*
- 41 1, 2020):
- 42 (l) No licensee shall sell or dispose of any property, other than bullion
- or coins, acquired in any transaction in the course of business in less
- 44 than [five] ten days after the date of such transaction, and no licensing
- authority may require a licensee to refrain from selling or disposing of
- such property for more than [five] ten days after the date of such

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- 47 transaction. The licensing authority may grant exemptions from the
- 48 requirements of this subsection for good cause shown.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To (1) remove the sunset date relating to methods of payment that secondhand dealers and precious metals or stones dealers may use when paying for property received, and (2) require dealers of precious metals and stones to retain certain property for ten days prior to the sale or disposition of such property.
