AN ACT CONCERNING THE PUBLIC SAFETY CAPACITY OF STATE PARKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 That the general statutes be amended to require (1) the Commissioner

2 of Energy and Environmental Protection to adopt regulations on or

3 before January 31, 2024, to provide a list of the public safety capacities

4 for each state park, and (2) the park ranger of each such park to close the

5 park to new entrants when such capacity is reached, regardless of the

6 method of entry to the park by such entrants, whether by vehicle or on

7 foot. As well to provide that the Commissioner of Energy and

8 Environmental Protection shall include the following factors in

9 determining such public safety capacity: (A) The number of visitors that

10 can be safely supervised taking into account the staffing at such park;

11 (B) if a water body is in such park, the number of swimmers that can be

12 safely supervised, taking into account the lifeguard staffing in such

park; (C) the parking capacity at such park; and (D) the pedestrian and

14 vehicular traffic on a state or municipal highway leading to such park

- 15 that threatens, or in all reasonable likelihood will threaten, public safety
- 16 by pedestrians walking on the side of the state or municipal highway,
- or by the high volume of vehicles parked or moving on a state or
- 18 municipal highway that blocks the free movement of emergency
- 19 vehicles. The commissioner may use the number of vehicles entering the
- 20 park as a proxy for the number of visitors.

Statement of Purpose:

To provide for the safety of state park visitors.
