## AN ACT CONCERNING EMERGENCY INTERVENTION BY A POLICE OFFICER WHEN A PERSON IS INCAPACITATED BY DRUGS OR DUE TO A MEDICAL EMERGENCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 17a-683 of the general statutes is repealed and the
 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2023*):

3 (a) Any police officer finding a person who appears to be 4 intoxicated in a public place and in need of help may, with such 5 person's consent, assist such person to [his] <u>such person's</u> home, a 6 treatment facility, or a hospital or other facility able to accept such 7 person.

8 (b) Any police officer finding a person who appears to be 9 incapacitated by alcohol, by drugs or due to a medical emergency shall 10 take [him] <u>such person</u> into protective custody and have [him] <u>such</u> 11 <u>person</u> brought forthwith (1) to a treatment facility which provides 12 medical triage in accordance with regulations adopted pursuant to 13 section 19a-495, or (2) to a hospital. The police, in detaining the person 14 and in having [him] <u>such person</u> brought forthwith to such a treatment 15 facility or a hospital, shall be taking [him] such person into protective 16 custody and shall make every reasonable effort to protect [his] such 17 person's health and safety. In taking the person into protective 18 custody, the detaining officer may take reasonable steps to protect 19 himself or herself. A taking into protective custody under this section 20 is not an arrest. No entry or other record shall be made to indicate that 21 the person has been arrested or charged with a crime. For purposes of 22 this section, "medical triage" means a service which provides 23 immediate assessment of symptoms of substance abuse, the immediate 24 care and treatment of [these] medical emergencies and such symptoms 25 as necessary, a determination of need for treatment [,] and assistance in 26 attaining appropriate continued treatment.

27 (c) A person who is brought to a treatment facility which provides 28 medical triage in accordance with regulations adopted pursuant to 29 section 19a-495 or to a hospital shall be examined by a medical officer 30 or [his] such medical officer's designee as soon as possible. The 31 medical officer shall determine whether the person requires inpatient 32 treatment based upon the medical examination of the person and upon 33 a finding that the person is incapacitated by alcohol, by drugs or due 34 to a medical emergency.

35 (d) If the medical officer determines that the person requires 36 inpatient treatment, the person shall be (1) admitted to, referred to or 37 detained at a treatment facility that provides medical treatment for 38 detoxification or a hospital, or (2) committed to a treatment facility 39 operated by the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services 40 for emergency treatment pursuant to the provisions of section 17a-684. 41 A person treated under subdivision (1) of this subsection shall be 42 admitted as a voluntary patient, or, if necessary, detained for necessary 43 treatment. If such person is referred to another treatment facility or 44 another hospital, the referring facility or hospital shall arrange for [his] 45 such person's transportation.

(e) Any person admitted or detained as a patient under subdivision(1) of subsection (d) of this section shall be released once [he] <u>such</u>

48 <u>person</u> is no longer incapacitated [by alcohol] or within forty-eight
49 hours, whichever is shorter, unless [he] <u>such person</u> consents to further
50 medical evaluation or treatment.

(f) If a patient is admitted to a treatment facility or hospital, [his]
<u>such person's</u> family or next of kin shall, unless prohibited by federal
law, be notified as promptly as possible. If a patient who is not
incapacitated [by alcohol] requests that there be no notification, [his]
<u>such</u> request shall be respected.

56 (g) A person who is not admitted to a treatment facility or a 57 hospital, is not referred to another treatment facility or hospital and 58 has no funds may be taken to [his] <u>such person's</u> home, if any. If [he] 59 <u>such person</u> has no home, the facility shall assist [him] <u>such person</u> in 60 obtaining shelter.
