AN ACT REPEALING THE REQUIREMENT THAT SPECIAL EDUCATION TEACHERS PASS AN ADDITIONAL READING EXAMINATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 That subsection (f) of section 10-145d of the general statutes be 2 amended to repeal the requirement that any certified employee 3 applying for a comprehensive special education endorsement, or 4 applicant for an initial, provisional or professional educator certificate 5 and a comprehensive special education endorsement achieve a 6 satisfactory score on the reading instruction examination approved by 7 the State Board of Education on April 1, 2009, or a comparable reading 8 instruction examination with minimum standards that are equivalent 9 to the examination approved by the State Board of Education on April 10 1, 2009.

Statement of Purpose:

To address issues of special education teacher shortages in urban school districts by repealing the requirement that special education teachers pass an additional reading examination.
