AN ACT CONCERNING THE LICENSE RENEWAL FEE AND SCHEDULE FOR LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKERS AND LICENSED MASTER SOCIAL WORKERS AND THE EXAMINATION REQUIREMENT FOR LICENSURE OF MASTER SOCIAL WORKERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Section 20-1950 of the general statutes is repealed and the 2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (Effective October 1, 2022):
- 2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2023*):

(a) Application for licensure shall be on forms prescribed and
furnished by the commissioner. Each applicant shall furnish evidence
satisfactory to the commissioner that he or she has met the
requirements of section 20-195n. The application fee for a clinical social
worker license shall be three hundred fifteen dollars. The application
fee for a master social worker license shall be two hundred twenty
dollars.

10 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 20-195n concerning 11 examinations, on or before [October 1, 2015] <u>April 1, 2026</u>, the 12 commissioner may issue a license without examination, to any master 13 social worker applicant who demonstrates to the satisfaction of the commissioner that, on or before October 1, [2013] <u>2023</u>, he or she held a
master's degree from a social work program accredited by the Council
on Social Work Education or, if educated outside the United States or
its territories, completed an educational program deemed equivalent
by the council.

19 (c) Each person licensed pursuant to this chapter may apply for 20 renewal of such licensure in accordance with the provisions of subsection (e) of section 19a-88, as amended by this act. A fee of one 21 22 hundred [ninety-five] dollars shall accompany each renewal 23 application for a licensed master social worker or a licensed clinical 24 social worker. Each such applicant shall furnish evidence satisfactory 25 to the commissioner of having satisfied the continuing education 26 requirements prescribed in section 20-195u.

27 (d) (1) An individual who has been convicted of any criminal 28 offense may request, in writing, at any time, that the commissioner 29 determine whether such individual's criminal conviction disqualifies 30 the individual from obtaining a license issued or conferred by the 31 commissioner pursuant to this chapter based on (A) the nature of the 32 conviction and its relationship to the individual's ability to safely or 33 competently perform the duties or responsibilities associated with 34 such license, (B) information pertaining to the degree of rehabilitation 35 of the individual, and (C) the time elapsed since the conviction or 36 release of the individual.

(2) An individual making such request shall include (A) details of
the individual's criminal conviction, and (B) any payment required by
the commissioner. The commissioner may charge a fee of not more
than fifteen dollars for each request made under this subsection. The
commissioner may waive such fee.

(3) Not later than thirty days after receiving a request under this
subsection, the commissioner shall inform the individual making such
request whether, based on the criminal record information provided,
such individual is disqualified from receiving or holding a license

(4) The commissioner is not bound by a determination made under
this subsection, if, upon further investigation, the commissioner
determines that an individual's criminal conviction differs from the
information presented in the determination request.

51 Sec. 2. Subsection (e) of section 19a-88 of the general statutes is 52 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective* 53 *October 1, 2023*):

54 (e) (1) Each person holding a license or certificate issued under 55 section 19a-514, 20-65k, 20-74s, 20-185k, 20-185l, 20-195cc or 20-206ll 56 and chapters 370 to 373, inclusive, 375, 378 to 381a, inclusive, 383, [to 57 383c, inclusive] 383a, 383c, 383g, 384, 384a, 384b, 385, 393a, 395, 399 or 58 400a and section 20-206n or 20-206o shall, annually, or, in the case of a 59 person holding a license as a marital and family therapist associate 60 under section 20-195c on or before twenty-four months after the date 61 of initial licensure, during the month of such person's birth, apply for 62 renewal of such license or certificate to the Department of Public 63 Health, giving such person's name in full, such person's residence and 64 business address and such other information as the department 65 requests.

(2) Each person holding a license or certificate issued under section
19a-514, and chapters 384a, 384c, 384d, 386, 387, 388 and 398 shall
apply for renewal of such license or certificate once every two years,
during the month of such person's birth, giving such person's name in
full, such person's residence and business address and such other
information as the department requests.

(3) Each person holding a certificate issued under section 20-195ttt
shall apply for renewal of such certificate once every three years,
during the month of such person's birth, giving such person's name in
full, such person's residence and business address and such other
information as the department requests.

77 (4) Each person holding a license or certificate issued pursuant to 78 chapter 400c shall, annually, during the month of such person's birth, 79 apply for renewal of such license or certificate to the department. Each 80 lead training provider certified pursuant to chapter 400c and each 81 asbestos training provider certified pursuant to chapter 400a shall, 82 annually, during the anniversary month of such training provider's 83 initial certification, apply for renewal of such certificate to the 84 department.

(5) Each entity holding a license issued pursuant to section 20-475
shall, annually, during the anniversary month of initial licensure,
apply for renewal of such license or certificate to the department.

(6) Each person holding a license issued pursuant to section 20162bb shall, annually, during the month of such person's birth, apply
for renewal of such license to the Department of Public Health, upon
payment of a fee of three hundred twenty dollars, giving such person's
name in full, such person's residence and business address and such
other information as the department requests.

94 (7) Each person holding a license issued under chapter 383b shall,
95 on or before twenty-four months after the date of initial licensure,
96 during the month of such person's birth, apply for renewal of such
97 license to the Department of Public Health, giving such person's name
98 in full, such person's residence and business address and such other
99 information as the department requests.
