AN ACT CONCERNING CONCUSSION EDUCATION FOR COACHES OF YOUTH ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 21a-432 of the general statutes is repealed and the
 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2019*):

3 (a) For purposes of this section:

4 (1) "Youth athletic activity" means an organized athletic activity 5 involving participants of not less than seven years of age and not more 6 than nineteen years of age, who (A) (i) engage in an organized athletic 7 game or competition against another team, club or entity or in practice 8 or preparation for an organized game or competition against another 9 team, club or entity, or (ii) attend an organized athletic camp or clinic 10 the purpose of which is to train, instruct or prepare such participants 11 to engage in an organized athletic game or competition, and (B) (i) pay 12 a fee to participate in such organized athletic game or competition or 13 attend such camp or clinic, or (ii) whose cost to participate in such 14 athletic game or competition or attend such camp or clinic is

sponsored by a municipality, business or nonprofit organization.
"Youth athletic activity" does not include any college or university
athletic activity, or an athletic activity that is incidental to a nonathletic
program or lesson; [and]

(2) "Operator" means any municipality, business or nonprofit
organization that conducts, coordinates, organizes or otherwise
oversees any youth athletic activity but shall not include any
municipality, business or nonprofit organization solely providing
access to, or use of, any field, court or other recreational area, whether
for compensation or not; [.] and

(3) "Youth coach" means any person who volunteers or is paid to act
 as a head coach, manager or instructor, or an assistant coach, manager
 or instructor of a youth athlete activity conducted on a field, court or
 other recreational area owned, operated or managed by a municipality.

29 (b) Not later than January 1, 2016, and annually thereafter, each 30 operator of a youth athletic activity shall make available a written or 31 electronic statement regarding concussions to each youth athlete and a 32 parent or legal guardian of each youth athlete participating in the 33 youth athletic activity. Such written or electronic statement shall be 34 made available upon registration of each youth athlete and shall be 35 consistent with the most recent information provided by the National 36 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding concussions. 37 Such written or electronic statement shall include educational content 38 addressing, at a minimum: (1) The recognition of signs or symptoms of 39 a concussion, (2) the means of obtaining proper medical treatment for a 40 person suspected of sustaining a concussion, (3) the nature and risks of 41 concussions, including the danger of continuing to engage in youth 42 athletic activity after sustaining a concussion, and (4) the proper 43 procedures for allowing a youth athlete who has sustained a 44 concussion to return to athletic activity.

45 (c) Not later than January 1, 2020, each youth coach of a youth

46 <u>athletic activity shall complete the Online Concussion Course for</u>
47 <u>Youth Sports Coaches available on the National Centers for Disease</u>
48 <u>Control and Prevention's Internet web site. Any youth coach that has</u>

- 49 <u>completed such course shall not be required to complete such course</u>
- 50 <u>again.</u>
- 51 [(c)] (d) (1) No operator, or designee of such operator, shall be 52 subject to civil liability for failing to make available the written or 53 electronic statement regarding concussions pursuant to subsection (b) 54 of this section.
- 55 (2) No person, organization or entity, including, but not limited to, a
- 56 youth coach, municipality, business or nonprofit organization, shall be
- 57 <u>subject to civil liability due to the failure of a youth coach to take the</u>
- 58 Online Concussion Course for Youth Sports Coaches pursuant to
- 59 <u>subsection (c) of this section.</u>

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following
sections:Section 1July 1, 201921a-432

Statement of Purpose:

To require youth coaches of youth athletic activities conducted on fields, courts and recreational areas owned, operated or managed by municipalities to take an online concussion course.
