AN ACT PROHIBITING THE MISREPRESENTATION OF A DOG AS A SERVICE ANIMAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2019) (a) For purposes of this
- 2 section, (1) "disability" has the same meaning as provided in 28 CFR
- 3 35.108, (2) "service dog" has the same meaning as "service animal" as
- 4 provided in 28 CFR 35.104, (3) "service dog in training" means a dog
- 5 that is being trained to become a service dog, (4) "service dog trainer"
- 6 has the same meaning as provided for "person training a dog as a
- 7 service dog" in section 46a-44 of the general statutes, as amended by
- 8 this act, and (5) "place of public accommodation, resort or amusement"
- 9 has the same meaning as provided in section 46a-63 of the general
- 10 statutes.
- 11 (b) No person shall misrepresent a pet dog as a service dog or
- 12 service dog in training for the purpose of obtaining any rights or
- privileges afforded persons with disabilities who are accompanied by
- service dogs. A person misrepresents a dog as a service dog or service
- dog in training when such person knows or should know that the dog

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- is not trained as a service dog but takes the dog into a place of public accommodation, resort or amusement or on public transportation where pets are not permitted and (1) falsely states that the dog is a service dog or service dog in training, or (2) outfits the dog with a special cape, vest, leash or other form of identification that states or implies that the dog is a service dog.
 - (c) Any person violating this section shall have committed an infraction and shall be fined not more than ninety dollars.

- (d) Any police officer or animal control officer may investigate an alleged violation of this section and enforce the provisions of this section by making inquiry in accordance with permissible questions for owners of service dogs as set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended from time to time. Refusal by a person with a dog represented as a service dog to answer the permissible questions shall create a presumption that the dog is not a service dog and the officer may issue a citation and require the person to remove the dog from the place of public accommodation, resort or amusement or from public transportation.
- (e) The Commissioner of Rehabilitation Services shall prepare and make available to businesses upon request: (1) A decal suitable for posting in a front window or door, stating that service dogs are welcome and that misrepresentation of a service dog is a violation of state law, and (2) a brochure detailing permissible questions under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 that a business owner may ask in order to determine whether a dog is a service dog, proper answers to those questions and guidelines defining unacceptable behavior.
- Sec. 2. Section 46a-44 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2019*):
 - (a) Any blind, deaf or mobility impaired person or any person training a dog as a [guide] service dog, as defined in section 1 of this act, for a blind person or [an assistance dog to assist] a deaf or mobility impaired person may travel on a train or on any other mode of public

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transportation, and may enter any other public place of accommodation which caters or offers its services or facilities or goods to the general public, including but not limited to, any public building, inn, restaurant, hotel, motel, tourist cabin, place of amusement, resort or any facility of any such public accommodation, accompanied by such person's [guide] service dog, [or assistance dog,] and such person may keep such dog with him or her at all times in any such public accommodation or facility thereof at no extra charge, provided such dog shall be in the direct custody of such person, shall qualify as a service animal in accordance with the provisions of 28 CFR 35.104 and shall be wearing a harness or an orange-colored leash and collar.

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(b) Any blind, deaf or mobility impaired person or any person training a dog as a [guide] service dog [for a blind person or an assistance dog to assist a deaf or mobility impaired person] shall be entitled to visit any place of public accommodation, resort or amusement or a dwelling as a guest of a lawful occupant thereof, accompanied by such person's [guide dog or assistance] service dog, and such person may keep such dog with him or her at all times in such public accommodation, resort, amusement or dwelling at no extra charge, provided such dog shall be in the direct custody of such person and shall qualify as a service animal in accordance with the provisions of 28 CFR 35.104 and be wearing a harness or an orange-colored leash and collar. No such blind, deaf or mobility impaired person or person training a dog as a [guide dog or an assistance] service dog shall be charged any fee not applicable alike to all guests, provided the owner of such dog shall be liable for any damage done to the premises or facilities by such dog. For the purposes of this subsection, (1) a "place of public accommodation, resort or amusement" means any establishment which caters or offers its services or facilities or goods to the general public, including, but not limited to, any commercial building lot, on which it is intended that a commercial property or building will be constructed or offered for sale or rent, and (2) "dwelling" means any building, structure, mobile manufactured home park or portion thereof which is occupied as, or designed or intended

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for occupancy as, a residence by one or more families, and any vacant land which is offered for sale or lease for the construction or location thereon of any such building, structure, mobile manufactured home park or portion thereof, provided the provisions of this subsection shall not apply to (A) the rental of a room or rooms in a single-family dwelling unit, if the owner actually maintains and occupies part of such living quarters as the owner's residence or (B) a unit in a dwelling containing living quarters occupied or intended to be occupied by no more than two families living independently of each other, if the owner actually maintains and occupies the other such living quarters as the owner's residence.

- (c) Any person who intentionally interferes with a blind, deaf or mobility impaired person's use of a [guide dog or an assistance] service dog, including, but not limited to, any action intended to harass or annoy the blind, deaf or mobility impaired person, the person training a dog as a [guide dog or assistance] service dog or the [guide dog or assistance] service dog, or who denies the rights afforded to a blind, deaf or mobility impaired person or person training a dog as a [guide dog or an assistance] service dog under subsection (a) or (b) of this section shall be guilty of a class C misdemeanor, provided such blind, deaf or mobility impaired person or person training a dog as a [guide dog or an assistance] service dog complies with the applicable provisions of subsection (a) or (b) of this section.
- (d) For the purposes of this section, ["guide dog" or "assistance dog"] "service dog" includes a dog being trained as a [guide dog or assistance] service dog and "person training a dog as a [guide dog for a blind person or an assistance dog to assist a deaf or mobility impaired person"] service dog" means a person who is employed by and authorized to engage in designated training activities by a [guide dog organization or assistance] service dog organization that complies with the criteria for membership in a professional association of [guide dog or assistance] service dog schools and who carries photographic identification indicating such employment and authorization, or a person who volunteers for a [guide dog organization or assistance]

(a) It shall be a discriminatory practice in violation of this section: (1)

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- 125 To deny any person within the jurisdiction of this state full and equal 126 accommodations in any place of public accommodation, resort or 127 amusement because of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, 128 gender identity or expression, marital status, age, lawful source of 129 income, intellectual disability, mental disability, physical disability, 130 including, but not limited to, blindness or deafness, or status as a 131 veteran, of the applicant, subject only to the conditions and limitations 132 established by law and applicable alike to all persons; (2) to 133 discriminate, segregate or separate on account of race, creed, color, 134 national origin, ancestry, sex, gender identity or expression, marital 135 status, age, lawful source of income, intellectual disability, mental 136 disability, learning disability, physical disability, including, but not 137 limited to, blindness or deafness, or status as a veteran; (3) for a place 138 of public accommodation, resort or amusement to restrict or limit the 139 right of a mother to breast-feed her child; (4) for a place of public 140 accommodation, resort or amusement to fail or refuse to post a notice, 141 in a conspicuous place, that any blind, deaf or mobility impaired 142 person, accompanied by [his guide] a service dog, as defined in section 143 1 of this act, that is wearing a harness or an orange-colored leash and
 - collar, may enter such premises or facilities; or (5) to deny any blind,

LCO No. 3700 **5** of 6 impaired person or any person training a dog as a [guide dog for a blind person or a dog to assist a deaf or mobility impaired person] service dog may keep [his guide dog or assistance] such dog with him at all times in such place of public accommodation, resort or amusement at no extra charge, provided the dog qualifies as a service animal in accordance with the provisions of 28 CFR 35.104, wears a harness or an orange-colored leash and collar and is in the direct custody of such person. The blind, deaf or mobility impaired person or person training a dog as a [guide dog for a blind person or a dog to assist a deaf or mobility impaired person] service dog shall be liable for any damage done to the premises or facilities by [his] such dog. For purposes of this subdivision, ["guide dog" or "assistance dog"] "service dog" includes a dog being trained as a [guide dog or assistance] service dog and "person training a dog as a [guide dog for a blind person or a dog to assist a deaf or mobility impaired person" service dog means a person who is employed by and authorized to engage in designated training activities by a [guide dog organization or assistance] service dog organization that complies with the criteria for membership in a professional association of [guide dog or assistance] service dog schools and who carries photographic identification indicating such employment and authorization.
