**RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CONTINUATION OF THE PUBLIC
HEALTH AND CIVIL PREPAREDNESS EMERGENCIES IN THE STATE.**

Resolved by this Assembly:

1 WHEREAS, on February 11, 2020, the World Health Organization
2 designated the respiratory virus "COVID-19" or coronavirus 2019, as a
3 communicable respiratory disease; and

4 WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020, in response to the global pandemic of
5 COVID-19 that was affecting multiple countries and states and had
6 resulted in the spread of infections in Connecticut and surrounding
7 states, Governor Ned Lamont declared a public health emergency and
8 civil preparedness emergency throughout the state, pursuant to sections
9 19a-131a and 28-9 of the general statutes; and

10 WHEREAS, on multiple occasions since March 10, 2020, acting
11 pursuant to the authority granted by sections 19a-131 and 28-9 of the
12 general statutes and special acts 21-2, 21-4 and 21-5, and in response to

13 the continued need to respond adequately to the COVID-19 pandemic,
14 the Governor renewed the declarations of public health and civil
15 preparedness emergencies and issued new declarations of public health
16 and civil preparedness emergencies, the most recent of which will
17 expire on February 15, 2022; and

18 WHEREAS, pursuant to said declarations of public health and civil
19 preparedness emergencies, the Governor issued certain executive
20 orders to protect the public health and mitigate the effects of the COVID-
21 19 pandemic and several of those executive orders remain necessary to
22 protect the public health and mitigate such harmful effects; and

23 WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a respiratory disease that spreads easily
24 from person to person and may result in serious illness or death and the
25 World Health Organization has declared the COVID-19 outbreak a
26 pandemic; and

27 WHEREAS, COVID-19 has resulted in serious consequences for the
28 residents of the state and the state's economy; and

29 WHEREAS, COVID-19 has resulted in and continues to present
30 increased risk of severe illness, complications, and death, particularly to
31 those with chronic conditions; and

32 WHEREAS, the omicron variant of COVID-19 is highly contagious,
33 more transmissible and spreads more quickly throughout the
34 population than other COVID-19 variants and has caused COVID-19
35 infections to rapidly increase within the United States and Connecticut;
36 and

37 WHEREAS, given the continued harmful impact of COVID-19, it is
38 essential to the health, safety and welfare of Connecticut's citizens that
39 there continue to be declared public health and civil preparedness
40 emergencies to enable state agencies to access crucial federal funds
41 under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance
42 Act, 42 USC 5121 et seq., and the supplemental nutrition assistance
43 program; and

44 WHEREAS, article third of the Constitution of the state vests in the
45 Connecticut General Assembly broad police powers, including those
46 necessary to protect public health and safety, together with the ability
47 to take measures to prevent the introduction and spread of infectious
48 and contagious diseases.

49 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Connecticut General
50 Assembly hereby declares that a public health emergency and a civil
51 preparedness emergency continue to exist throughout the state through
52 June 30, 2022; and

53 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the clerks of the Senate and House
54 of Representatives cause a copy of this resolution to be sent to Governor
55 Ned Lamont, the Secretary of the State and each member of the
56 Connecticut congressional delegation.
