RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SYMPATHY ON THE DEATH OF REPRESENTATIVE EZEQUIEL SANTIAGO.

Resolved by this Assembly:

- 1 WHEREAS, on Friday, March 15, 2019, the State of Connecticut and
- 2 the city of Bridgeport lost a distinguished and beloved State
- 3 Representative with the passing of Representative Ezequiel "Chequi"
- 4 Santiago, at the age of forty-five; and
- 5 WHEREAS, he represented the 130th district with distinction for ten
- 6 years and to the date of his passing; and
- WHEREAS, he was born in Camden, New Jersey, on April 20, 1973,
- 8 and raised in the South End of Bridgeport, Connecticut; and

- 9 WHEREAS, he attended Gibbs College, where he earned a
- 10 certificate in Computer Technical Support; and
- 11 WHEREAS, he was a city statistics analyst for the city of Bridgeport;
- 12 and
- WHEREAS, he also had careers as a constituent representative for
- 14 the city of Bridgeport, a computer technical support representative for
- 15 On Line Marketing and an assistant teacher for Action for Bridgeport
- 16 Community Development; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he started his political career by volunteering on the
- 18 campaigns of his father, Americo Santiago, for State Representative
- 19 and Secretary of the State, and by assisting his stepfather, Mitch
- 20 Robles, with other local political campaigns; and
- 21 WHEREAS, he served on the Bridgeport City Council from 2005-
- 22 2008; and
- 23 WHEREAS, during his tenure as a City Councilman, he addressed
- 24 public safety issues in Bridgeport and helped secure Community
- 25 Development Block Grant funding for the YMCA, the South End
- 26 Community Center and the Cardinal Sheehan Center; and
- 27 WHEREAS, he was first elected as a State Representative in 2008,
- 28 representing the South End of Bridgeport and downtown Bridgeport
- 29 in a legislative seat previously held by his father, Americo Santiago;
- 30 and
- 31 WHEREAS, he served for five terms as a State Representative, and
- 32 served as vice chairperson of the Appropriations Committee, chairman
- of the Banking Committee, vice chairman of the Labor and Public
- 34 Employees Committee, and member of the Commerce Committee,
- 35 Environment Committee, Planning and Development Committee and
- 36 Transportation Committee; and
- 37 WHEREAS, he also served as Deputy Majority Whip in the
- 38 Connecticut House of Representatives; and

- WHEREAS, he was selected by his peers in the Bridgeport delegation to lead the delegation in the 2019 legislative session; and
- 41 WHEREAS, as a member of the General Assembly, he worked
- 42 tirelessly to, among other things, win approval for a Bridgeport casino,
- 43 raise the minimum wage, extend the foreclosure mediation program,
- 44 protect worker's rights, improve police training, increase local police
- 45 force hiring, increase minority representation in the court system, close
- 46 the achievement gap and protect funding for local social service
- 47 agencies; and
- 48 WHEREAS, he is survived by his parents, Americo Santiago and
- 49 Evelyn Robles; his stepfather, Mitch Robles; his three daughters,
- 50 Lenymar Matos, ILenny Matos and Chelsie M. Santiago; his
- 51 grandmothers, Lydia Antonia Mercado and Olga Molina; his brother,
- 52 Eddie Omar Santiago (Jodi Anastasia Santiago); his two sisters,
- 53 Michelle Robles (Jason Rivera) and April Robles; and his girlfriend,
- 54 Paula Romero; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Connecticut
- 56 General Assembly expresses its sincere sympathy and heartfelt
- 57 condolences on the passing of one of its honorable members, Ezequiel
- 58 Santiago, whose death is a profound loss to the House of
- 59 Representatives, his family and friends, the residents of Bridgeport
- and the entire State of Connecticut; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the clerks of the House of
- Representatives and the Senate cause a copy of this resolution to be
- sent to the family of Ezequiel Santiago, as an expression of the high
