RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE JOINT RULES OF THE NOVEMBER SPECIAL SESSION, 2022.

Resolved by this Assembly:

1 That the joint rules of this Special Session shall be the same as the joint

2 rules in force at the 2022 regular session, except as said rules are3 amended, altered or repealed in this resolution.

House Joint Resolution No.

11 by the Governor, dated November 23, 2022, convening the General

12 Assembly in Special Session on November 28, 2022, shall be received.

13 The Legislative Commissioners' Office shall prepare all bills and 14 resolutions. When a bill or resolution has been prepared by the 15 Legislative Commissioners' Office and signed by the Speaker and 16 President Pro Tempore, the bill or resolution shall immediately be given 17 to the clerk of the Senate or the House as designated. Before or at the 18 time the bill or resolution is given to the clerk, the Legislative 19 Commissioners' Office shall provide to the Office of Fiscal Analysis 20 copies of each bill or resolution to prepare a fiscal note if required by 21 Rule 15 of the joint rules.

Each bill and resolution shall be printed, without interlineation or erasure. The duplicate copies of each bill or resolution shall be made on yellow-colored and blue-colored paper, respectively, of the same size and format as the original.

26 Each bill amending any statute or special act shall set forth in full the 27 section or subsection of the statute or the special act to be amended. 28 Matter to be omitted or repealed shall be surrounded by brackets or 29 overstricken so that the omitted or repealed matter remains readable, 30 and new matter shall be indicated by capitalization or underscoring of 31 all words in the original bill and by capitalization, underscoring or 32 italics in its printed form. In the case of a section or subsection not 33 amending an existing section of the general statutes but intended to be 34 part of the general statutes, the section or subsection may be in upper 35 and lower case letters preceded by the word (NEW).

Each bill and resolution shall be transmitted, in triplicate by theLegislative Commissioners' Office to the clerks of the House or Senate.

38 The clerks shall number each bill and resolution.

The clerks shall certify and keep on file a duplicate copy of each billand resolution. The certified duplicate copy shall remain at all times in

41 the clerk's office. If the original cannot be located, a copy of such certified

42 duplicate copy shall be made by the clerk and used in lieu of the original.

43 The clerk shall make a notation on the certified duplicate copy of all44 action taken on the original.

Any member of the General Assembly may co-sponsor a bill or resolution by making a request in writing after it has been filed, to the clerk of the chamber in which the bill or resolution has been filed to add his or her name as a co-sponsor of the bill or resolution, but not later than the date of the signing of the bill, or the deadline for the signing of the bill, by the Governor, whichever is earlier, or the adoption of the resolution.

"resolutions".

 14. Upon passage in the first house, the bill or resolution shall be

68 transmitted immediately to the second house.

70 15. Any bill or substantive resolution which if passed or adopted, 71 would affect state or municipal revenue, or would require the 72 expenditure of state or municipal funds, shall have a fiscal note 73 attached. Any fiscal note printed with or prepared for a bill or resolution 74 shall be solely for the purpose of information, summarization and 75 explanation for members of the General Assembly and shall not be 76 construed to represent the intent of the General Assembly or either 77 chamber thereof for any purpose. Each such fiscal note shall bear the 78 following disclaimer: "The following Fiscal Impact Statement is 79 prepared for the benefit of the members of the General Assembly, solely 80 for purposes of information, summarization and explanation and does 81 not represent the intent of the General Assembly or either chamber 82 thereof for any purpose." When an amendment is offered to a bill or 83 resolution in the House or the Senate, which, if adopted, would require 84 the expenditure of state or municipal funds or affect state or municipal 85 revenue, a fiscal note shall be available at the time the amendment is 86 offered. Any fiscal note prepared for such an amendment shall be 87 construed in accordance with the provisions of this rule and shall bear 88 the disclaimer required under this rule.

90 BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS - READINGS

91 16. First reading of a bill or resolution shall be by title and number.92 Second reading shall be passage or rejection of the bill or resolution.

93 Strike out Rule 17 and insert in lieu thereof the following:

17. Each bill or substantive resolution may be acted upon
immediately. No bill or substantive resolution may be acted upon unless
it is accompanied by a fiscal note.

Each bill and substantive resolution shall be voted upon by a roll call
vote. A bill or resolution, certified in accordance with section 2-26 of the
general statutes, if filed in the House, may be transmitted to and acted
upon first by the Senate with the consent of the Speaker; and if filed in
the Senate, may be transmitted to and acted upon first by the House
with the consent of the President Pro Tempore.
