AN ACT ASSISTING SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN IMPROVING EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 10-14z of the general statutes is
 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*, 2024):

4 (a) There is established an Office of Dyslexia and Reading Disabilities 5 within the Department of Education which shall be under the 6 management of a chief. The chief shall be qualified by training and 7 experience to perform the duties of the office, including, but not limited 8 to, expertise in higher education, dyslexia and structured literacy. The 9 Office of Dyslexia and Reading Disabilities shall (1) verify the 10 compliance of (A) educator preparation programs, as defined in section 11 including intermediate administrator and supervisor 10-146c, 12 programs, and (B) applicants for an initial, provisional or professional 13 educator certificate pursuant to the provisions of chapter 166 relating to 14 scientifically-based reading research and instruction, as defined in

15 section 10-14u, structured literacy instruction and training, dyslexia 16 instruction and training, including, but not limited to, the compliance 17 verifications required pursuant to sections 10-14aa to 10-14cc, inclusive; 18 (2) review and recommend changes, as necessary, to the State Board of 19 Education's process for approval of educator preparation programs 20 related to such compliance verifications; and (3) provide guidance to 21 and consult with the department's Talent Office related to such 22 compliance verifications.

Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of section 10-14gg of the 2024 supplement to the
general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
thereof (*Effective July 1, 2024*):

26 (a) The Department of Education shall establish a Center for Literacy 27 Research and Reading Success within the department. The center shall 28 be responsible for (1) the implementation of the coordinated state-wide 29 reading plan for students in kindergarten to grade three, inclusive, 30 established pursuant to section 10-14v; (2) researching and developing, 31 in collaboration with the Office of Early Childhood, a birth to grade 32 twelve reading success strategy to be included in the alignment of 33 reading instruction with the two-generational initiative, established 34 pursuant to section 17b-112l; (3) (A) providing direct support to schools 35 and boards of education to improve reading outcomes for students in 36 kindergarten to grade three, inclusive, and other reading initiatives, and 37 (B) supporting teachers, schools and boards of education engaged in 38 improving through coaching, leadership training, professional 39 development, parental engagement and technical assistance that is 40 consistent with the intensive reading instruction program, as described 41 in section 10-14u and aligned with evidence-based practices; (4) 42 providing independent, random reviews of how a local or regional 43 board of education is implementing (A) a comprehensive reading 44 curriculum model or program for grades kindergarten to grade three, 45 inclusive, pursuant to section 10-14hh, and (B) an approved reading 46 assessment, pursuant to section 10-14t; (5) receiving and publicly 47 reporting, not later than September 1, 2025, and biennially thereafter, 48 the comprehensive reading curriculum model or program being

49 implemented by each local and regional board of education pursuant to 50 section 10-14hh; (6) developing and maintaining an Internet web site for 51 the purpose of disseminating tools and information associated with the 52 intensive reading instruction program for student reading; and (7) 53 serving as a collaborative center for institutions of higher education and 54 making available to the faculty of teacher preparation programs [(A) the 55 science of teaching reading, (B) the intensive reading instruction 56 program, and (C) samples of available comprehensive reading curriculum models or programs reviewed and approved pursuant to 57 section 10-14ii; and (8) reviewing and publicly reporting on progress 58 59 made by teacher preparation programs to include comprehensive reading curriculum models or programs reviewed and approved 60 pursuant to section 10-14ii] (A) resources and research supporting 61 scientifically-based reading instruction, and (B) Connecticut's K-3 62 63 Literacy Strategy, developed by the center.

64 Sec. 3. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2024*) Not later than July 1, 2025, the 65 Department of Education shall develop compliance measures and audit 66 procedures to determine the compliance of educator preparation 67 programs, including intermediate administrator and supervisor 68 programs, in the provision of instruction on scientifically-based reading 69 research and instruction, as defined in section 10-14u of the general 70 statutes.

71 Sec. 4. (NEW) (Effective from passage) Not later than September 1, 2024, 72 and every five years thereafter, the State Board of Education shall 73 develop, and revise as necessary, a model policy on the use of cellular 74 mobile telephones and other mobile electronic devices, as defined in 75 section 10-222d of the general statutes, in schools. Such policy shall 76 consider the various needs of students, such as age and grade level, and 77 include appropriate enforcement provisions. The department shall 78 make such model policy available on its Internet web site.

Sec. 5. (*Effective July 1, 2024*) (a) As used in this section, "advanced
course or program" means an honors class, advanced placement class,
International Baccalaureate program, Cambridge International

program, dual enrollment program, dual credit course or program,
early college program or any other advanced or accelerated course or
program that is offered, and for which credit is awarded, by a local or
regional board of education in grades nine to twelve, inclusive.

86 (b) The Department of Education shall conduct a study regarding the 87 feasibility of establishing and administering a state-wide program that supports public high school students in participating in an advanced 88 89 course or program, and which gives priority to students from low-90 income families. In conducting such study, the department shall consult with local and regional boards of education and public and independent 91 92 institutions of higher education. Such study shall review current in-state 93 programs to provide advanced courses or programs, identify and 94 analyze similar programs in other states, and provide recommendations 95 on the framework and criteria for implementing a state-wide program 96 in the state.

97 (c) Not later than January 1, 2026, the department shall submit such 98 report, and any recommendations on the establishment and 99 implementation of such state-wide program, to the joint standing 100 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters 101 relating to education in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a 102 of the general statutes.

103 Sec. 6. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2024) Not later than January 1, 2025, 104 and every five years thereafter, the Department of Education shall 105 develop and make available to local and regional boards of education, a 106 guide of recommended resource allocation strategies designed to target 107 the allocation and expenditure of local, state and federal funds to 108 improve student academic outcomes. Such guide shall include, but need 109 not be limited to, recommendations relating to the percentage of funds 110 boards of education should expend on administrative overhead and 111 ongoing costs related to the provision of public education, such as 112 teacher salaries, other specialized education interventions and any other 113 categories the department determines is relevant and is based on best 114 practices. The department shall make such guide available in its Internet 115 web site.
