AN ACT CONCERNING THE INSTALLATION OF CAMERA VIDEO SYSTEMS INSIDE SCHOOL BUSES AND STUDENT TRANSPORTATION VEHICLES USED TO TRANSPORT STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS AND THE MAXIMUM SPEED SCHOOL BUSES MAY TRAVEL ON A DIVIDED LIMITED ACCESS HIGHWAY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (Effective from passage) The Commissioner of Education 2 shall study issues related to the installation of camera video systems 3 inside school buses and student transportation vehicles used to 4 transport students with special needs and make recommendations 5 regarding the installation and operation of such systems and the 6 storage, security and use of recordings. Not later than January 1, 2021, 7 the commissioner shall submit the results of such study and any 8 recommendations, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of 9 the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General 10 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to education and 11 transportation.

12 Sec. 2. (*Effective from passage*) The Department of Transportation shall 13 study whether section 14-281a of the general statutes should be amended to increase the maximum speed a school bus may travel on a divided limited access highway. Not later than January 1, 2021, the department shall submit a report of the results of such study and any recommended legislation to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to transportation, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To study (1) issues related to the installation of camera video systems inside school buses and student transportation vehicles used to transport students with special needs, and (2) whether to increase the maximum speed a school bus may travel on a divided limited access highway.
