AN ACT CONCERNING TRAFFIC STOPS FOR SUSPECTED CANNABIS USE BY DRIVERS AND TESTS FOR THE DETECTION OF CANNABIS USE BY DRIVERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 That (1) section 53a-213a of the general statutes be amended to allow 2 a law enforcement officer to stop a motor vehicle when the sole reason 3 for the stop is a suspected violation of the prohibition on smoking, otherwise inhaling or ingesting cannabis while driving; and (2) the 4 5 general statutes be amended to require the Police Officer Standards and 6 Training Council to study the use of mouth swabs and saliva tests for 7 detection of cannabis use by drivers and, if such use is feasible, adopt 8 policies to implement use of such swabs and tests by police officers.

Statement of Purpose:

To promote public safety by enhancing enforcement of driving while under the influence of cannabis.
