AN ACT INCREASING THE AGE FROM EIGHT TO EIGHTEEN YEARS FOR AN INCOME-ELIGIBLE PERSON TO OBTAIN MEDICAL ASSISTANCE REGARDLESS OF IMMIGRATION STATUS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (l) of section 17b-261 of the 2022 supplement to

the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
thereof (*Effective July 1, 2022*):

4 (l) On and after January 1, 2023, the Commissioner of Social Services 5 shall, within available appropriations, provide state-funded medical 6 assistance to any child [eight years of age and younger] or young adult 7 under nineteen years of age, regardless of immigration status, (1) whose 8 household income does not exceed two hundred one per cent of the 9 federal poverty level without an asset limit, and (2) who does not 10 otherwise qualify for Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance 11 Program, or an offer of affordable, employer-sponsored insurance as 12 defined in the Affordable Care Act, as an employee or a dependent of 13 an employee.

14 Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of section 17b-292 of the 2022 supplement to the

general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieuthereof (*Effective July 1, 2022*):

17 (a) A child who resides in a household with household income that 18 exceeds one hundred ninety-six per cent of the federal poverty level but 19 does not exceed three hundred eighteen per cent of the federal poverty 20 level may be eligible for benefits under HUSKY B. Not later than 21 January 1, 2023, the Commissioner of Social Services shall, within 22 available appropriations, provide state-funded medical assistance to 23 any child [eight years of age and younger] or young adult under nineteen years of age, regardless of immigration status, (1) with a 24 25 household income that exceeds two hundred one per cent of the federal 26 poverty level but does not exceed three hundred twenty-three per cent 27 of the federal poverty level, and (2) who does not otherwise qualify for 28 Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program, or an offer of affordable, employer-sponsored insurance as defined in the Affordable 29 30 Care Act, as an employee or a dependent of an employee.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

To provide medical assistance for income-eligible persons under nineteen years of age regardless of immigration status.
