## AN ACT CONCERNING RAISING THE THRESHOLD FOR UNEMPLOYMENT OVERPAYMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (f) of section 31-273 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (Effective from passage):
(f) Any person who knowingly makes a false statement or representation or fails to disclose a material fact in order to obtain, increase, prevent or decrease any benefit, contribution or other payment under this chapter, or under any similar law of another state or of the United States in regard to which this state acted as agent pursuant to an agreement authorized by section 31-225, whether to be made to or by [himself or herself] such person or any other person, and who receives any such benefit, pays any such contribution or alters any such payment to [his or her] such person's advantage by such fraudulent means (1) shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor if such benefit, contribution or payment amounts to [five hundred] two thousand dollars or less ${ }_{\llcorner }$or (2) shall be guilty of a class $D$ felony if such benefit, contribution or

16 payment amounts to more than [five hundred] two thousand dollars. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 54-193, no person shall be prosecuted for a violation of the provisions of this subsection committed on or after October 1, 1977, except within five years next after such violation has been committed.
