**AN ACT REQUIRING THE CONNECTICUT HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGE TO REPORT ADDITIONAL DATA.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 38a-1092 of the general statutes is  
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1,*  
3 *2020*):

4 (a) (1) Not later than March 31, 2014, and quarterly thereafter, the  
5 exchange board of directors shall report to the joint standing committees  
6 of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public  
7 health, human services and insurance concerning health care services  
8 provided through the exchange. Such reports shall include: [(1)] (A) The  
9 number of persons in households with incomes from one hundred  
10 thirty-three per cent up to one hundred fifty per cent of the federal  
11 poverty level who were enrolled in a qualified health plan at any time  
12 on or after January 1, 2014; [(2)] (B) the number of persons in households  
13 with incomes from one hundred fifty per cent up to and including two  
14 hundred per cent of the federal poverty level who were enrolled in a  
15 qualified health plan at any time on and after January 1, 2014; [(3)] (C)

16 the number of persons in households with incomes from one hundred  
17 thirty-three per cent up to and including two hundred per cent of the  
18 federal poverty level who have been continuously enrolled in a  
19 qualified health plan during the current calendar year; [(4)] (D) the  
20 number of persons in households with incomes from one hundred  
21 thirty-three per cent up to and including two hundred per cent of the  
22 federal poverty level who were enrolled in a qualified health plan and  
23 who subsequently became eligible to receive benefits under the  
24 Medicaid program or whose household income increased to more than  
25 two hundred per cent of the federal poverty level; [(5)] (E) the number  
26 of persons in households with incomes from one hundred thirty-three  
27 per cent up to and including two hundred per cent of the federal poverty  
28 level who experienced a gap in health care coverage; [(6)] (F) the cost to  
29 the state of providing health care services to persons identified in  
30 subparagraph (E) of this subdivision [(5) of this subsection] and the cost  
31 to such persons to access health care coverage through the exchange;  
32 [(7)] (G) the cost of the second-lowest-priced silver premium plan in the  
33 exchange; and [(8)] (H) any other information that said board believes  
34 would be necessary to allow said committees to evaluate the cost and  
35 benefits of a basic health plan.

36 (2) Commencing with the first report due under subdivision (1) of  
37 this subsection after July 1, 2020, the exchange board of directors shall  
38 include the following additional information in each report required  
39 under subdivision (1) of this subsection: (A) The number of individuals  
40 who enrolled in the Medicaid program in the quarter via the exchange;  
41 (B) the number of individuals who enrolled in a qualified health plan in  
42 the quarter through the exchange and which plans such individuals  
43 selected; (C) whether each individual reported enrolled under  
44 subparagraph (A) or (B) of this subdivision was insured immediately  
45 prior to such enrollment and, if so, the source of such insurance; and (D)  
46 the number of individuals enrolled in the quarter through the exchange  
47 who were eligible for a federal subsidy.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

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***Statement of Purpose:***

To require the Connecticut Health Insurance Exchange board of directors to report additional data in its quarterly reports to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public health, human services and insurance.
