AN ACT CONCERNING THE INCOME AND ASSET LIMITS ALLOWING EMPLOYED PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES TO RECEIVE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (Effective from passage) (a) The Commissioner of Social
- 2 Services shall study whether the income and asset limits allowing
- 3 employed persons with disabilities to receive medical assistance
- 4 pursuant to section 17b-597 of the general statutes should be increased
- 5 to (1) provide sufficient access to medical assistance to such persons, and
- 6 (2) promote employment advancement of such persons.
- 7 (b) The commissioner shall submit a report on the study not later than
- 8 January 1, 2021, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the
- 9 general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General
- 10 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to human services. The
- 11 report shall include, but not be limited to: (1) The number of working
- 12 persons with disabilities participating in the program authorized
- pursuant to section 17b-597 of the general statutes, (2) the number of
- 14 such persons who may become eligible per income and asset level if

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- income and asset limits are increased, (3) the number of such persons
- 16 who may become eligible if the income limit for cost sharing is
- increased, (4) the number of states with higher income and asset levels
- 18 for the program that allows such persons to receive medical assistance,
- 19 and (5) the fiscal impact to the state of raising the income and asset limits
- 20 per income and asset level.

Statement of Purpose:

To require the Commissioner of Social Services to study whether income and asset limits allowing employed persons with disabilities to receive medical assistance should be increased.
