AN ACT CONCERNING THE CREATION AND EXPANSION OF COMPUTER SCIENCE OPPORTUNITIES IN SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 That title 10 of the general statutes be amended to (1) require that all 2 high schools in the state offer computer science beginning in the school 3 year commencing July 1, 2021, (2) require that all elementary and 4 middle schools in the state provide computer coding instruction to 5 students, (3) require the creation of a computer science endorsement 6 for teacher certification, (4) require the creation of an alternate route to 7 certification program for computer science teachers, (5) require that 8 programs of teacher preparation include a computer science 9 component, (6) provide funding for the inclusion of computer science 10 in teacher professional development programs, (7) require the 11 development of a state-wide digital literacy curriculum and coding 12 curriculum for state-funded, after-school programs, and (8) require an 13 annual one-day summit that brings together students and top 14 industries in the state so that students can learn more about career

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15 opportunities in high-demand fields.

To create and expand opportunities for computer science instruction in schools.

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
