

Substitute Senate Bill No. 948

Public Act No. 23-93

AN ACT ADDING CERTAIN MEMBERS TO THE GOVERNOR'S WORKFORCE COUNCIL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 31-3i of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October* 1, 2023):

- (a) Pursuant to Section 101 of the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, P.L. 113-128, the members of the Governor's Workforce Council shall be:
 - (1) The Governor;
- (2) A member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, and a member of the Senate, appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate;
- (3) Twenty-four members, appointed by the Governor, who (A) are owners of a business, chief executives or operating officers of a business, or other business executives or employers with optimum policy-making or hiring authority; (B) represent businesses or organizations representing businesses that provide employment opportunities that, at a minimum, include high-quality, work-relevant training and

development in in-demand industry sectors or occupation in the state; or (C) have been nominated by state business organizations or business trade associations. At a minimum, at least one such member shall represent small businesses, as defined by the United States Small Business Administration.

- (4) The Labor Commissioner, Commissioner of Aging and Disability Services, Commissioner of Education, Commissioner of Economic and Community Development and the Chief Workforce Officer, or their respective designees;
- (5) Four representatives of labor organizations, who have been nominated by state labor federations and appointed by the Governor;
- (6) An individual, appointed by the Governor, who is a member of a labor organization or a training director from a joint labor-management apprenticeship program, or, if no such joint program exists in the state, such a representative of an apprenticeship program in the state;
- (7) An individual, appointed by the Governor, who is an expert in residential construction;
- [(7)] (8) Five members, appointed by the Governor, who represent community-based organizations that have demonstrated experience and expertise in addressing employment, training, or education, including one representative of a community action agency, as defined in section 17b-885, and one representative of a philanthropic organization;
- [(8)] (9) A representative from the Connecticut State Colleges and Universities, a representative from The University of Connecticut and a representative from a nonprofit institution of higher education in the state, each appointed by the Governor;
 - (10) A representative from a regional vocational-technical school and

- a representative from a regional agricultural science and technology school, each appointed by the Governor;
- [(9)] (11) Two superintendents of a local or regional board of education, appointed by the Governor;
- [(10)] (12) Two chief elected officials of municipalities, appointed by the Governor; and
- [(11)] (13) Two members of the public, who are enrolled in or who have recently completed a nondegree workforce training program, appointed by the Governor.
