AN ACT CONCERNING THE INCLUSION OF COMPUTER SCIENCE INSTRUCTION IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CURRICULUM, PROGRAMS OF TEACHER PREPARATION AND IN-SERVICE TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR TEACHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 10-16b of the general statutes is
 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July* 1, 2019):

4 (a) In the public schools the program of instruction offered shall 5 include at least the following subject matter, as taught by legally 6 qualified teachers, the arts; career education; consumer education; 7 health and safety, including, but not limited to, human growth and 8 development, nutrition, first aid, including cardiopulmonary 9 resuscitation training in accordance with the provisions of section 10-10 16qq, disease prevention and cancer awareness, including, but not 11 limited to, age and developmentally appropriate instruction in 12 performing self-examinations for the purposes of screening for breast 13 cancer and testicular cancer, community and consumer health,

14 physical, mental and emotional health, including youth suicide 15 prevention, substance abuse prevention, including instruction relating to opioid use and related disorders, safety, which shall include the safe 16 17 use of social media, as defined in section 9-601, and may include the 18 dangers of gang membership, and accident prevention; language arts, 19 including reading, writing, grammar, speaking and spelling; 20 mathematics; physical education; science, which may include the 21 climate change curriculum described in subsection (d) of this section; 22 social studies, including, but not limited to, citizenship, economics, 23 geography, government, history and Holocaust and genocide 24 education and awareness in accordance with the provisions of section 25 10-18f; computer science, including, but not limited to, computer 26 programming instruction; and in addition, on at least the secondary 27 level, one or more world languages and vocational education. For 28 purposes of this subsection, world languages shall include American 29 Sign Language, provided such subject matter is taught by a qualified 30 instructor under the supervision of a teacher who holds a certificate 31 issued by the State Board of Education. For purposes of this 32 subsection, the "arts" means any form of visual or performing arts, 33 which may include, but not be limited to, dance, music, art and theatre.

Sec. 2. Subsection (d) of section 10-145a of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*, 2019):

(d) On and after July 1, [1998] <u>2019</u>, any [candidate in a] program of
teacher preparation leading to professional certification shall [complete
a] <u>include, as part of the curriculum, instruction in</u> computer <u>science</u>,
and other information technology skills, [component of such program,]
as applied to student learning and classroom instruction,
communications, [and] data management, <u>programming and coding</u>.

43 Sec. 3. Subsection (a) of section 10-220a of the general statutes is
44 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*45 1, 2019):

46 (a) Each local or regional board of education shall provide an in-47 service training program for its teachers, administrators and pupil 48 personnel who hold the initial educator, provisional educator or professional educator certificate. Such program shall provide such 49 50 teachers, administrators and pupil personnel with information on (1) 51 the nature and the relationship of alcohol and drugs, as defined in 52 subdivision (17) of section 21a-240, to health and personality 53 development, and procedures for discouraging their abuse, (2) health 54 and mental health risk reduction education that includes, but need not 55 be limited to, the prevention of risk-taking behavior by children and 56 the relationship of such behavior to substance abuse, pregnancy, 57 sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV-infection and AIDS, as 58 defined in section 19a-581, violence, teen dating violence, domestic 59 violence and child abuse, (3) school violence prevention, conflict 60 resolution, the prevention of and response to youth suicide and the identification and prevention of and response to bullying, as defined in 61 62 subsection (a) of section 10-222d, except that those boards of education 63 that implement any evidence-based model approach that is approved 64 by the Department of Education and is consistent with subsection (c) 65 of section 10-145a, sections 10-222d, 10-222g and 10-222h, subsection 66 (g) of section 10-233c and sections 1 and 3 of public act 08-160, shall not 67 be required to provide in-service training on the identification and 68 prevention of and response to bullying, (4) cardiopulmonary 69 resuscitation and other emergency life saving procedures, (5) the 70 requirements and obligations of a mandated reporter, [and] (6) the 71 detection and recognition of, and evidence-based structured literacy 72 interventions for, students with dyslexia, as defined in section 10-3d, 73 and (7) computer science, including, but not limited to, computer 74 programming. Each local or regional board of education may allow 75 any paraprofessional or noncertified employee to participate, on a 76 voluntary basis, in any in-service training program provided pursuant 77 to this section.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
