AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF CERTAIN RODENTICIDES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective October 1, 2023) (a) For purposes of this 2 section, "second-generation anticoagulant rodenticide" means any pesticide product containing any of the following active ingredients: (1) 3 4 Brodifacoum; (2) bromadiolone; (3) difenacoum; or (4) difethialone. 5 (b) No person shall use, apply, sell or distribute any secondgeneration anticoagulant rodenticide in this state. 6 7 (c) The provisions of subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to 8 any of the following uses or locations: 9 (1) The use of second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides for 10 public health activities in accordance with any provision of the Public Health Code; 11 12 (2) The use of second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides for the

13 purposes of protecting water supply infrastructure and facilities in a

14 manner that is consistent with all otherwise applicable federal and state

15 laws and regulations;

16 (3) The use of any registered second-generation anticoagulant 17 rodenticide to control an actual or potential rodent infestation 18 associated with a public health need, as determined by a supporting 19 declaration from the Commissioner of Public Health or a director of 20 health. For purposes of this subdivision, "public health need" means an 21 urgent, nonroutine situation posing a significant risk to human health 22 in which it is documented that other rodent control alternatives, 23 including nonchemical alternatives, are inadequate to control the rodent 24 infestation;

25 (4) A medical waste generator;

(5) Any facility registered annually and subject to inspection under
Section 510 of the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, 21 USC 360 et
seq. and that is compliant with the federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and
Rodenticide Act, 7 USC 135 et seq.; and

30 (6) Agricultural activity. For purposes of this subdivision,
31 "agricultural activity" additionally includes activities conducted in any
32 of the following locations:

(A) A warehouse used to store foods for human or animalconsumption;

(B) An agricultural food production site, including, but not limitedto, a slaughterhouse or cannery;

37 (C) A factory, brewery or winery;

38 (D) An agricultural production site housing water storage and39 conveyance facilities; or

40 (E) An agricultural production site housing rights-of-way and other41 transportation infrastructure.

42 (d) The Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection may

43 adopt regulations, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the 44 general statutes and this section, to ensure that the continued use of 45 second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides is not reasonably 46 expected to result in significant adverse effects to nontarget wildlife. 47 Such regulations shall include, but not be limited to, provisions for the 48 use of such rodenticides if the eradication of invasive rodent 49 populations is necessary for the protection of threatened or endangered 50 species or the habitats of such species.

(e) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (b) of this
section shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than five thousand
dollars by the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To prohibit the use of second-generation rodenticides in order to preserve hawk and other raptor populations in the state.
