AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS IN DIRECT CONTACT WITH OR IN THE CUSTODY OR CONTROL OF A PEACE OFFICER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2023*) (a) As used in this section:
- 3 (1) "Emergency medical condition" means a medical condition, 4 whether physical, behavioral, or related to a substance use disorder or 5 mental health disorder, that manifests itself by symptoms of sufficient 6 severity, including severe pain, that in the absence of prompt medical attention could reasonably be expected by a prudent layperson who 8 possesses an average knowledge of health and medicine to result in placing the health of the person in serious jeopardy, serious 10 impairment to body function or serious dysfunction of any body organ 11 or part;
- 12 (2) "Medically unstable" means any condition, whether physical, 13 behavioral, or related to a substance use disorder or mental health 14 disorder, that manifests in an unstable medical or mental health status,

- 15 which could reasonably be understood by a prudent layperson who 16 possesses an average knowledge of health and medicine to lead to an 17 emergency medical condition; and
- 18 (3) "Peace officer" has the same meaning as provided in section 53a-19 3 of the general statutes.
- 20 (b) Any person who experiences an emergency medical condition or 21 is medically unstable while in direct audio or visual contact with, or 22 under the custody or control of, a peace officer shall have the right to 23 be provided with emergency medical services.
- 24 (c) A peace officer shall immediately request emergency medical 25 services for any person who is under such officer's custody or control 26 or otherwise in direct audio or visual contact with the peace officer 27 when such person: (1) Has communicated to the peace officer that the 28 person is (A) experiencing an emergency medical condition, or (B) 29 medically unstable, or (2) has been observed by the peace officer to be 30 (A) experiencing an emergency medical condition, or (B) medically unstable.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
