BE IT ENACTED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Domestic Violence Hotline Establishment Act of 2013". Sec. 2. The Office of Victim Services shall: (a) Establish and provide a direct toll-free hotline to services for victims and potential victims of domestic violence. This hotline shall: (1) Be directly available to callers, without an intermediary agency; (2) Be available on a 24-hour basis; (3) Provide live assistance to callers; (4) Offer an anonymous reporting feature to enable a victim or a friend of a victim to report an incident without giving their legal name; and (5) Coordinate with the existing domestic violence first responder line to refer victims for crisis intervention. (b) Engage in a public outreach campaign to educate residents about the hotline.
