A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To designate the alleyway that runs east and west in Square 756, between Massachusetts Avenue, N.E., and C Street, N.E. in Ward 6 as Walter Way in recognition of the family that owned the William Walter's Son Carriage Repository and coach shop in that alleyway at the turn of the century.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Walter Way Designation Act of 2015".

Sec. 2. Pursuant to sections 401 and 403 of the Street and Alley Closing and Acquisition Procedures Act of 1982, effective March 10, 1983 (D.C. Law 4-201; D.C. Official Code §§ 9-204.01 and 9-204.03) ("Act"), and notwithstanding the requirements of sections 407 and 408 of the Act (D.C. Official Code §§ 9-204.07 and 9-204.08), the Council designates the alleyway that runs east and west in Square 756 in Ward 6 as "Walter Way".

Sec. 3. Transmittal.

The Chairman of the Council shall transmit a copy of this act, upon its effective date, to the District Department of Transportation.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 5. Effective date.

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.
