IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend the District of Columbia Traffic Adjudication Act of 1978 to provide a waiver for parking infractions when the registered owner of a vehicle does not receive proper notice of the infraction within two years of its issuance and to provide an eight year statute of limitations for collecting parking and moving infraction fines.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Parking Ticket Waiver Act of 2017".

Sec. 2. A new section 309 is added to The District of Columbia Traffic

Adjudication Act of 1978, effective September 12, 1978 (D.C. Law 2-104; D.C. Official

Code § 50-2303.03 et seq.), to read as follows:

"Sec. 309. "Waiver for Infractions."

"(a) If no answer to a notice of infraction is provided pursuant to Section

305 (D.C. Official Code § 50-2303.05) within one year of its issuance, the Mayor shall

mail a second notice of infraction to the name and address of the registered owner of the

vehicle on file with the Department of Motor Vehicles.

"(b) An infraction pursuant to Section 301 et seq. (D.C. Official Code §

50-2303.01 et seq.) that has not been answered within two years of its issuance shall be

waived if the requirements in subsection (a) have not been met by the Mayor and the

registered owner of the vehicle proves by a preponderance of evidence that notice was
