Dear Chairman Mendelson:

Enclosed for consideration and approval by the Council of the District of Columbia is the "Leave and Retirement Modifications for Chief of Police Peter Newsham Amendment Act of 2017."

The proposed bill would modify the leave provisions applicable to Executive Service to provide annual and sick leave accrual for the Chief of Police Peter Newsham, authorize the Mayor to enter into Executive Service employment contracts with terms consistent with prevailing recruitment customs, make additional technical corrections; and amend the District of Columbia Policemen and Firemen's Retirement and Disability Act to provide that, upon retirement from the Metropolitan Police Department, Chief Newsham shall be entitled to an annuity computed at 80% of his average highest base pay for 24 consecutive months.

4 A BILL 5 6 7 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA 8 9 10 To amend the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978 to 11 modify the leave provisions applicable to Peter Newsham as Chief of Police of the 12 Metropolitan Police Department; and to amend the Policemen and Firemen's Retirement 13 and Disability Act to provide that Peter Newsham, as Chief of Police of the Metropolitan 14 Police Department, shall be entitled to an annuity computed at 80% of his average pay in 15 effect over any 24 consecutive months upon retirement or voluntary separation from the 16 Metropolitan Police Department. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this 18 act may be cited as the "Leave and Retirement Modifications for Chief of Police Peter Newsham 19 Amendment Act of 2017". 20 Sec. 2. Section 1061 of the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit 21 Personnel Act of 1978, effective June 10, 1988 (D.C. Law 12-124; D.C. Official Code § 1-22 610.61), is amended as follows: 23 (a) The existing text is designated as subsection (a). 24 (b) A new subsection (b) is added to read as follows: 25 "(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, Peter Newsham, while serving as 26 Chief of Police, shall earn leave under section 1203, consistent with the leave he earned as a 27 member of the Metropolitan Police Department based upon his years of service immediately
