IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To establish a process by which an Advisory Neighborhood Commission can request a School Parking Zone, where public-school staff may park at designated times.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Daytime School Parking Zone Act of 2018”.

Sec. 2. School parking zones.

(a) For the purposes of this section, the term:

(1) “ANC” means an Advisory Neighborhood Commission.

(2) “ANC Act” means the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975, effective October 10, 1975 (D.C. Law 1-21; D.C. Official Code § 1–309.01 *et seq.*).

(3) “Department” means the District Department of Transportation.

(4) “School parking zone” means a defined area of public roadway near a public school or public charter school where certain employees of the public school or public charter school, as designated by the Mayor or the Mayor’s designee, who are not otherwise eligible to park on such roadway, may park.

25 (b) Pursuant to section 13(h)(1) of the ANC Act, an ANC may request that the
26 Department establish a school parking zone near a public school or public charter school within
27 the boundaries of the ANC by transmitting a resolution passed by the ANC to the Department.

28 (c) Notwithstanding section 13(h)(1) of the ANC Act, the Department, no later than 60
29 days after receipt of an ANC resolution transmitted pursuant to subsection (b) of this section,
30 shall:

31 (1) Deny the request by transmitting a written response to the ANC, explaining
32 the reasons for denial; or

33 (2) Send a proposal to establish a school parking zone to the ANC that transmitted
34 the resolution pursuant to subsection (b) of this section, and to any adjacent ANC within 1300
35 feet of the proposed zone, which shall describe:

36 (A) The boundaries of the proposed school parking zone;

37 (B) The methods by which the Department will implement and enforce
38 restrictions on parking in the proposed school parking zone, such as issuing permits to
39 employees of the public school or public charter school or installing parking meters that permit
40 only employees of the public school or public charter school to pay for parking; and

41 (C) The hours and days that restrictions on parking in the proposed school
42 parking zone will be enforced.

43 (3) If the Department proposes to establish a school parking zone, it shall also
44 send the information required in subsection (2) to the public school or public charter school that
45 is near the proposed school parking zone.

46 (d) The Mayor, pursuant to Title I of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure
47 Act, approved October 21, 1968 (82 Stat. 1204; D.C. Official Code § 2-501 et seq.), shall issue
48 rules to implement the provisions of this section, including provisions to address the following:

49 (1) Factors to be considered by the Department when reviewing a proposed school
50 parking zone include:

51 (A) Preservation of Pickup and drop-off areas for students; and

52 (B) Determination of the size of a School Parking Zone;

53 (2) Design of, Display of, and eligibility requirements for any passes that may be
54 used in implementing a school parking zone;

55 (e) Nothing in this act shall be construed to restrict the Department's existing authority to
56 regulate parking and the Department shall have the authority to establish school parking zones
57 absent a request from an ANC.

58 (f) Nothing in this act shall be construed to supersede the additional notice requirements
59 required by the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975, effective March 26, 1976
60 (D.C. Law 1-58; D.C. Official Code § 1-309.10).

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63 Sec. 3. Applicability.

64 (a) This act shall apply upon the date of inclusion of its fiscal effect in an approved
65 budget and financial plan.

66 (b) The Chief Financial Officer shall certify the date of the inclusion of the fiscal effect in
67 an approved budget and financial plan, and provide notice to the Budget Director of the Council
68 of the certification.

69 (c)(1) The Budget Director shall cause the notice of the certification to be published in
70 the District of Columbia Register.

71 (2) The date of publication of the notice of the certification shall not affect the
72 applicability of this act.

73 Sec. 4. Fiscal impact statement.

74 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal
75 impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,
76 approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

77 Sec. 5. Effective date.

78 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
79 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as
80 provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
81 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
82 Columbia Register.
